CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chairman Butts called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Aron Wolf led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION AND ACTION BY THE COMMISSION

A. September 30, 2009, Minutes

The commission adopted the minutes on a motion by Commissioner Evelyn Jerome Alexander seconded by Commissioner Clinton Simmons.

B. American Airports - Project Manager's Report

Mr. Scott Wardle reported on events at General Wm. J. Fox Airfield:

- A Chili Cook-off with a Car and Airplane Show is scheduled for October 31, 2009, at 10 a.m. This event will be hosted by Fox Field Airport in conjunction with the Lancaster Rotary Club.
- On September 15, 2009, Ms. Julie Clark, an aerobatics pilot, visited the airport for an autograph-signing event.
- Minor damages to the fencing and landscaping of the airport caused by high winds have been corrected.

Mr. Andrew Marino reported on events at Compton/Woodley Airport:

 Construction of the Compton/Woodley Airport Pavement Rehabilitation project is scheduled to begin Monday, November 2, 2009.

Runway 25-R will be closed Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. until Phase I of the project is completed. Also, the main gate along Alondra Boulevard will be closed, and the self-fuel Island will not be available during this construction. Flyers providing information and project updates have been distributed throughout the airport and to the other County airports.

Mr. Jared Fox-Tuck reported on events at Brackett Field Airport:

- In a coordinated effort between the Aviation Division and the County's Department of Parks and Recreation, 45 to 50 trees will be trimmed on the western perimeter of the airport.
- The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) picnic area improvements project is moving forward and near completion.
- No updates to report on the construction project on the southeast area of the airport.
- 20 foot of fencing will be replaced due to a small vehicle incident.
- Construction of the taxiway exit project will start November 30, 2009.

Mr. Rafael Herrera reported on events at El Monte Airport:

- On October 8, 2009, in anticipation of Veteran's Day, the U.S. and the California flags were replaced with new ones in the terminal building.
- On October 9, 2009, El Monte Airport hosted a meeting for the El Monte School District.
- On October 16, 2009, El Monte Airport hosted an airport tour for Pearl Preparatory School. Over 25 kindergarten and first-grade children attended this event.
- All handicapped signs were replaced in the terminal parking lot with highly durable and reflective signs.
- A preconstruction meeting was held this morning to discuss the taxiway development project. Construction is scheduled to begin December 2009.

Mr. Jason Morgan reported on events at Whiteman Airport:

- APIP 60 LLC will be constructing 5 additional hangars adjacent to the existing U.S. Marshal Hangar.
- The Whiteman Airport Association meeting was held on October 10, 2009.
 The next meeting is scheduled for November 19, 2009, at 7 p.m.
- A meeting was held with Jorge Villanueva and Gustavo Morales, leaders
 of the Pacoima Beautiful Group, to discuss and introduce to them a new
 information pamphlet regarding the next master plan public meeting. The
 pamphlet will be distributed throughout the Pacoima community.
- Lighting improvements were completed at the public area as part of the security and safety recommendations from airport tenants.

- On November 6, 2009, a new air conditioning system will be installed in the air traffic control tower.
- The airport currently has 10-vacant hangars.

C. County Contract Administrator's Report - Mr. Richard Smith

The Commission was provided with copies of the September 2009 expense and revenue report, and Mr. Richard Smith offered to answer any questions.

Commissioner Simmons asked if the expenses under Grants Management are internal charges within the Department. Mr. Smith responded that the reason Grants Management is charging the Aviation Division is because they have been working closely with the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) grant for Compton/Woodley Airport.

Commissioner Aron Wolf asked why charges under staff support have increased. Mr. Smith stated the labor cost has increased this current year due to full staffing in the division, and the charges reflecting in the increase from July to September will be researched and reported next month.

- A draft final report has been received for the Whiteman Airport Master Plan Update. Aviation Division is working with the Environmental Planning & Assessments Section of Programs Development Division to do an initial study for development Alternative 1.
- The Federal Aviation Administration approved the contract for the Master Plan Update at Fox Airfield. The consultants will be present at the next Aviation Commission meeting to introduce their company and provide a short presentation.
- Move in for the Compton/Woodley Airport Pavement Rehabilitation project has begun with the delivery of k-rails, low-profile barricades, chainlink fencing, and office trailers. Construction is expected to begin November 2, 2009.

D. Whiteman Airport Additional Items

No additional items to report.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT – OPEN FORUM

Mr. Bill Logan expressed concern about the construction of 50-feet hangars stating that his personal preference is 30 and 40-feet hangars to be considered for upcoming construction projects.

Mr. Gary Golson inquired about the lighting replacement at Compton/Woodley Airport. He also expressed concern about whether airport users would have to buy fuel and pay the truck price when the fuel island closes during construction.

Mr. Scott Wardle stated that he would discuss this concerns and comments with upper management.

Mr. Jack Kenton expressed his concern about hangar and runway access during construction. He stated that 90 days of construction is a long period of time, and he would like to have American Airports consider reasonable rent reductions.

Mr. Jared Chacon of AC Flying Club asked the Commission to consider the inconvenience and the economic impact of the project on businesses and airport tenants. He also requested a rent reduction during the 3 months of construction.

OTHER ITEMS

Mr. Smith informed the Commission that former Aviation Commissioner, Edward L. Brantley I, passed away, as a result of health issues related to his heart.

Commissioner Lord indicated that he met with members of Homeland Security and the California Emergency Management Agency to discuss grant opportunities for security upgrades at Compton/Woodley Airport. The members of Homeland Security recommended conducting a security assessment at Compton/Woodley Airport. Commissioner Lord, in conjunction with airport manager, Andrew Marino, volunteered to create a Security Assessment Committee and invited members of the Commission to participate in this endeavor.

Commissioner Lord shared with the Commission his rewarding experience while participating in the 50th Anniversary of Catalina Airport on October 18, 2009, where 141 aircraft landed on the airport and 400 people attended the event.
