NEVER throw Household Hazardous Waste / E-Waste (HHW/E-Waste) into your garbage, pour down the drain or flush in the toilet.

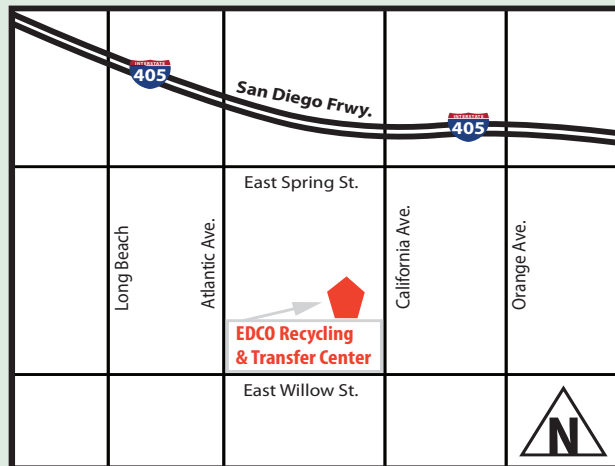

CHEMICALS



- ◆ Carefully secure items in your trunk/pick-up bed. Hazardous waste must be in your trunk/pick-up bed with no other items.

PAINTS & SOLVENTS



- ◆ Waste should be in a sturdy box, preferably in their original containers. Be prepared to leave containers.

E-WASTE



- ◆ No explosives, ammunition, radioactive materials, controlled substances, trash, tires, or large appliances (like refrigerators, stoves and washing machines).

SHARPS



- ◆ Sharps disposal will require exiting your vehicle in a designated location to deposit them in a bin.

- ◆ Open to Los Angeles County residents. No business waste accepted.

- ◆ Limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste per trip.

## TOO TOXIC TO TRASH

**Know Your HHW/E-Waste** — Household hazardous waste is any product labeled toxic, poisonous, corrosive, flammable, combustible or irritant. Electronic Waste is any electronic device such as a TV, cell phone, electronic game, microwave, computer and a small household appliance.

## How to Reduce Household Hazardous Waste

### 1. Buy Smart

Purchase non-toxic or less hazardous products and only purchase the amount you need.

### 2. Use It Up

Finish all products and recycle the containers or donate what is leftover.

### 3. Store Properly

Toxic products are poisonous - store them in a box until ready for disposal.

Keep products out of reach of children and pets.
