# 2. Possible Proposition 84 Water Conservation Projects

- a. Brian Dietrick spoke to the group about the Regional Water Management Group (RWMG) moving forward with state Proposition 84 grant applications.
  - i. The IRWMP Technical Committee recommended that water conservation projects be submitted to DWR.
  - ii. Projects must already be in the IRWM Plan. Focus will be on new water supply and projects in disadvantaged communities.
  - iii. Brian will call a meeting between PWD, Waterworks 40, City of Palmdale, AVEK, and AV Conservancy to discuss possible projects.
  - iv. If a consultant is engaged to put application together, Kennedy Jenks estimates a cost of \$90,000.

# 3. Agency Status on Water Conservation Efforts

#### a. City of Lancaster

- i. Lancaster's landscape ordinance was adopted on October 28, 2008.
  - 1. Changes due to State updating their landscape ordinance language.

- 2. Staff is working with landscape contractors to standardize plans.
- b. Los Angeles County Farm Bureau farmers saved 1,400 acre feet of potable water by using recycled water.
- c. City of Palmdale
  - i. Rec'd Prop 50 funds but cannot collect with current state budget deficit.
  - ii. Replacing turf in landscape maintenance districts. Working with PWD in a "cash for grass" program.
  - Discovered Waste Management charges customers to dispose of grass. Suggestion was made to combine city/agency efforts to propose a change in Waste Management policies.
  - iv. Ordinance # 1362 Water Efficient Landscape went into effect on November 14, 2008.
- d. Antelope Valley College
  - i. New greenhouse being built.
  - ii. Neal running the seminar schedule for the Home Show held at AV Fairgrounds on March 21<sup>st</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup>.
- e. Sue Mathis thanked Lancaster and Palmdale for implementing "smarter" landscape ordinances and plans.
- f. Quartz Hill Water District
  - i. Conducting outreach meetings regarding new water rate structure. Receiving good feedback from customers.
- g. AVEK
  - i. Expect a 15% allocation from the state next year.
  - ii. Looking into purchasing some supplemental supply.
  - iii. Took a tour of AVRCD Conservation Nursery on Avenue I at 100<sup>th</sup> Street West. Suggests everyone take a tour.
- h. Palmdale Water District
  - i. Still issuing will serve letters to developers.
  - ii. Bought water from Butte County to divert a severe water shortage for the District.
  - iii. Working on a new water rate structure. Going to Board on May 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - iv. WaterWise CD should be complete by and coming out in the next couple months.
  - v. Rebates coming: cash for grass, ET controllers, ultra-low flow toilets, HE washing machines, and MP rotators.
  - vi. Conducting a home owner landscape class on March 21.
- i. LA County Waterworks
  - i. Have done 220 rebates since rebate program inception. HE washers and toilets most popular.
  - ii. February 24-25<sup>th</sup> is the Landscape Convention at the LA Convention Center.
  - iii. Contractor approached Waterworks to retrofit toilets at hotels/motels in service area.
- j. Rosamond Community Services District
  - i. Writing a customer guide on water conservation in the High Desert.

- ii. Placing large thermometers around Rosamond to measure water conservation by percentage. Goal is to reduce water consumption by 10% by 2010.
- iii. Working on landscape ordinance which would restrict grass to 20% of entire lot size.
- iv. Conducting the District's 3rd water efficient workshop series class on
- February 14<sup>th</sup> from 9am to noon, Irrigation Design.
  v. Holding 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Water Efficient Landscape Contest. Deadline is June 19<sup>th</sup>. First place winner receives \$1,000, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$500 and 3<sup>rd</sup> \$250.
