October is **Filipino American History Month**, also known as **Filipino American Heritage Month**. The observation was established in 1988 by the Filipino American National Historical Society and is widely celebrated in California and Hawaii, where a large number of Filipino Americans reside.

The first Filipinos to set foot in North America arrived in Morro Bay, California. The first permanent Filipino settlement in North America was established in 1763 in Saint Malo, Louisiana. Since then, Filipino Americans have made substantial contributions to American society in the arts, sciences, music, and literature.

More than 250,000 brave and courageous Filipinos fought under the United States flag during World War II to protect and defend this country. At Public Works, we are proud of our Filipino employees and honor their heritage and culture every year.

October is also **National Disability Employment Awareness Month**, a national campaign that raises awareness about disability employment issues and celebrates the many and varied contributions of America's workers with disabilities. This year's theme is "A Strong Workforce is an Inclusive Workforce: What Can YOU Do?"
