National Women's History Month

March is National Women's History Month. The 2013 National Women's History Month theme, "**Women's Inspiring Innovation through Imagination: Celebrating Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics**" (STEM) honors generations of women who throughout American history have used their intelligence, imagination, sense of wonder, and tenacity to make extraordinary contributions to the STEM fields.

Our STEM workforce is crucial to America's innovative capacity and global competitiveness. Yet women are vastly underrepresented in STEM jobs and among STEM degree holders despite making up nearly half of the United States workforce and half of the college-educated workforce. That leaves an untapped opportunity to expand STEM employment in the United States, even as there is wide agreement that the nation must do more to improve its competitiveness.

There are many possible factors contributing to the discrepancy of women and men in STEM jobs, including a lack of female role models, gender stereotyping, and less family friendly flexibility in the STEM fields. Women's History Month offers parents, public, and private school teachers from kindergarten through college an immense opportunity to showcase women leaders and to discuss the challenges -- perceived and real, internal and external -- to women making strides in these traditionally male occupational tracks.

Director Farber Receives Local Heroes Award

LA County Public Works Director Gail Farber is the recipient of the KCET/Union Bank Local Heroes Award for **Women's History Month**. The awards celebrate the national commemorative heritage months and honor exemplary community leaders who strive to enrich the lives of others, and whose tireless contributions are inspiring hope in the minds and hearts of future generations. To date, more than 150 outstanding local heroes have been honored by the television network. Farber was nominated for her role as a female engineer in charge of the nation's largest public works agency, for leading and inspiring women to succeed in non-traditional roles, and her support of the Public Works Women's Leadership Council.
