General Description of Proposed Annexation
of City-Owned Lands To The City of Hawthorne

(For Publication Purposes Only)

These portions of Tract No. 8636 and the Pacific Electric Railway Company's right of way as shown on map recorded in Book 124, pages 34 to 36 inclusive, of Maps, records of the County of Los Angeles, described in general as follows:

That certain parcel of land lying easterly of and contiguous to the City of Hawthorne, bounded on the north by 120th Street, on the east by Doty Avenue and its extension, on the south by El Segundo Boulevard, and on the west by said City of Hawthorne.

Excepting therefrom the portion thereof lying southerly of the Pacific Electric Railway Company's right of way, northerly of the southerly lines of Lots 6 and 11, said tract, and easterly of Florwood Avenue (now vacated).

ANNEXATION OF THE CITY OWNED LANDS
TO CITY OF HAWTHORNE

NOTE: The affidavit of Completion, etc., was filed with the County Recorder August 5, 1940 (File No. 8-A), pursuant to Stats. 1939: Chapt 472 (Effective Sept. 19, 1939). However, the annexation was effective upon filing with the Secretary of State, Sept. 16, 1939, prior to the effective date of the above affidavit of completion law.

ANNEXATION OF CITY-OWNED LAND

(Under Statutes 1933, page 2396 as amended - - -
Act 5159b, Deering's General Laws 1937 and appendix)

By petition of the City of Hawthorne filed with the Board of Supervisors August 31, 1939, petitioning said Board for annexation of certain territory; by resolution of said Board adopted September 12, 1939, approving the annexation; and by notice filed with the Secretary of State September 16, 1939, the following described territory was annexed:

Beginning at the intersection of the easterly boundary of the City of Hawthorne as the same existed August 28, 1939, with the most northerly boundary of Tract 8636, Sheets 1 and 2, as shown on maps recorded in Book 124, pages 34 to 36 inclusive of Maps, records of the County of Los Angeles; thence easterly along the northerly boundary of said tract to the most northeasterly corner thereof; thence southerly along the easterly boundary of said tract and the southerly prolongation thereof to the southerly line of the Pacific Electric Railway Company's right of way as shown on said map; thence westerly along said southerly line to the center line of Florwood Avenue (formerly Florence Avenue), now vacated, as shown on said map; thence southerly along said center line to the westerly prolongation of the northerly line of Lot 7, Block P, of said tract; thence easterly in a direct line through the northeasterly corner of Lot 10, of said block, to the easterly boundary of said tract; thence southerly along said easterly boundary to the easterly prolongation of the southerly line of Lot 9, Block Q, of said tract; thence westerly in a direct line through the southwest corner of Lot 3, Block S, of said tract, to the easterly boundary of said City of Hawthorne; thence northerly along the boundary of said City and following the same in all its various courses to the point of beginning.



