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


Dear Mr. Keel:

On February 13, 1950 you sent us copies of Ordinance No. 498 and 502, and advised that Ordinance No. 502 (the McClune annexation) became effective February 17, 1950 and Ordinance No. 498 (the Hawthorne Airport Annexation No. 2) became effective on December 15, 1949. At the time you sent copies of these ordinances we acknowledged receipt of the same.

In order to change our records, however, it will be necessary for the City of Hawthorne to comply with Section 54901 of the Government Code which reads as follows:

"The statement shall set forth the legal description of the boundaries of the city or district created or changed and a map or plat indicating the boundaries."

KENNETH L. KEEL, being first duly sworn, disposes and says that he is the City Clerk of the City of Hawthorne, California; that he is familiar with the proceedings had and taken by the legislative body-to wit-the City Council of the City of Hawthorne, relating to the annexation to said City of certain uninhabited territory designated as the McClune Annexation, particularly described as Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof and delineated on the boundary line map attached hereto and marked Exhibit B; that the City Council initiated said proceedings on its own motion and adopted Resolution No. 2217 giving a notice of such property annexation and the time and place of hearing objections thereto; that said resolution was adopted on the 20th day of December, 1949, at a Regular Adjourned Meeting of the City Council, and thereafter published for two successive weeks in the Hawthorne - Lennox Advertiser, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Hawthorne; that thereafter and on the 10th day of January, 1950, a hearing on said annexation was held pursuant to said resolution and there being no protests, Ordinance No. 502 approving the said annexation was introduced, which ordinance was finally adopted at a Regular Adjourned Meeting of the City Council on January 17, 1950.

AFFIANT further states that to the best of his knowledge and belief all the requirements of the laws pertaining to the Annexation of Uninhabited Territory Act of 1939, under which the proceedings referred to were held, have been complied with.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
HAWTHORNE PROVIDING THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN  
UNINHABITED TERRITORY KNOWN AS THE MC CLUNE  
ANNEXATION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the "Annexation of Uninhabited Territory Act of 1919," as amended, the City Council of the City of Hawthorne did on the 20th day of December, 1949, initiate proceedings to annex certain uninhabited territory known as the McClune Act Annexation, hereinafter more particularly described; and,

WHEREAS, said territory is uninhabited and is contiguous to the City of Hawthorne and is not a part of any other municipal corporation; and,

WHEREAS, on the 20th day of December, 1949, the City Council passed a resolution giving notice of such proposed annexation, specifically describing the boundaries of the territory so proposed to be annexed, designating said annexation as the Mc Clune Annexation, and fixing the 10th day of January, 1950 at the hour of 8:00 P.M. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, Hawthorne, California, as the day, hour and place when and where any person owning real property within such territory, and having any objections to the proposed annexation, may appear before the City Council and show cause why such territory should not be so annexed; and

WHEREAS, said resolution was designated as Resolution No. 2217 and a copy of said resolution was published on the 23 and 30 day of December, 1949, in the Hawthorne-Lennox Advertiser, a newspaper of general circulation, published in the City of Hawthorne; and

WHEREAS, the time fixed for the hearing of objections to the proposed annexation has passed and no protest against the annexation has been made or filed; and,

WHEREAS, all proceedings have been in conformity with law;

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Hawthorne does ordain as follows:

340-A

SECTION 1. The annexation to the City of Hawthorne of that certain uninhabited territory contiguous to the westerly city limits of the City of Hawthorne, in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, known as the Mc Clune Act Annexation, is hereby approved, said territory being more particularly described as follows:

A — Lot 20, Block Z, Town of Hawthorne, in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, as described in the deed recorded in Book 15, Page 110 of Deeds, in the office of the County Recorder of said County. — A

SECTION 2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed, immediately upon this ordinance becoming effective, to make under the seal of the City of Hawthorne and to transmit to the Secretary of State of the State of California, a certified copy of this ordinance, giving the date of its passage.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file in the office of the County Recorder in the County of Los Angeles, an affidavit stating that all requirements of the laws pertaining to the Annexation proceedings have been complied with. Said affidavit shall be accompanied by a certified copy of the boundary description of the property annexed, as set forth in this ordinance, and also by a map delineating said boundaries.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause the same to be published at least once in the Hawthorne-Lennox Advertiser, a newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Hawthorne.
