

Nary a dissenting vote was cast when residents of the Hudson area, east of the city, decided to annex to Hawthorne.

"It's the only time I have ever heard of not having at least one negative vote in an inhabited annexation," said City Mgr. Joy West who pointed out that it was the first successful inhabited annexation to Hawthorne in years.

Thirty - three voters, representing 70% of those registered, went to the polls. The area involved contains some six acres and a population of about 175.

ORDINANCE NO. 714

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE,
CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE ANNEXATION TO
THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE OF CERTAIN INHAB-
ITED TERRITORY DESIGNATED AS "HUDSON
ANNEXATION."

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Annexation Act of 1913, and pursuant to Resolution No. 3317 adopted by the City Council of the City of Hawthorne on the 22nd day of May, 1961, a special election was held on the 11th day of July, 1961, in inhabited territory contiguous to the City of Hawthorne designated as "^{Hudson}~~Holland~~ Annexation", and which is hereinafter more particularly described; and

WHEREAS, at said special election the following question was submitted to the qualified electors residing in said territory:

SHALL "HUDSON ANNEXATION" BE ANNEXED TO THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE, CALIFORNIA?, and

WHEREAS, it appears from the canvass of the returns of the votes cast at the special election that a majority of all votes cast in said territory on the question of annexation favor annexation; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the special election and all proceedings relating thereto have been conducted strictly in accordance with law;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Hawthorne, California, does ordain as follows:

1. That the annexation of inhabited territory contiguous to the City of Hawthorne designated as "Hudson Annexation" be and the same is hereby approved. Said territory is described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the west line of Tract No. 15794 as per maps recorded in Book 347, pages 32-33 of Maps, records of Los Angeles County and the westerly prolongation of the northerly line of Lot 1 of said Tract, said intersection also being a point in the easterly boundary of the City of Hawthorne as same existed on June 1, 1960; thence, easterly along said westerly prolongation and said northerly line to the northwest corner of Lot 25 of said Tract; thence, easterly and southerly following along the northerly and easterly lines of said last mentioned lot to the southeast corner of said Lot 25; thence, southerly in a direct line to the northeast corner of Lot 15 of said Tract 15794; thence, southerly and westerly following along the easterly and southerly lines of said last mentioned Lot to the southwest corner of said Lot 15; thence, westerly along the south line of Lot 14 of said Tract 15794 and its westerly prolongation to said boundary of the City of Hawthorne; thence, northerly following said boundary to the point of beginning.

2. That this Ordinance shall go into effect and become operative thirty (30) days from the date of its approval, adoption and passage. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Hawthorne Press, a newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Hawthorne, California.







RESOLUTION NO. 3317

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE, CALIFORNIA, CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 11th DAY OF JULY, 1961, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS RESIDING IN THE TERRITORY KNOWN AS THE "HUDSON ANNEXATION" THE QUESTION WHETHER SUCH TERRITORY SHALL BE ANNEXED TO THE CITY OF HAWTHORNE, CALIFORNIA.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 3307, the City Council of the City of Hawthorne, California, declared its intention to call a special election in certain inhabited territory contiguous to said city proposed to be annexed to the city, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors residing in said territory the question whether or not the territory shall be annexed to the city; and

WHEREAS, a copy of said resolution was published as required by law; and

WHEREAS, at a time not later than the hour set by said resolution for hearing objections to the proposed election protests were not made by the owners or by public and private owners equal to one-half of the value of the territory proposed to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, all proceedings have been had in accordance with said resolution and the Annexation Act of 1913, reference thereto hereby being made for further particulars;

NOW THEREFORE, It Is Hereby Resolved by the City Council of the City of Hawthorne, California, as follows:

SECTION 1: A special election is hereby called to be held on the 11th day of July, 1961, in the territory hereinafter described and proposed to be annexed to the City of Hawthorne, California, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors residing in said territory the question whether or not such territory shall be annexed to, incorporated in, and made a part of said City of Hawthorne, California.

Said territory is described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the west line of Tract No. 15794 as per maps recorded in Book 347, pages 32-33 of Maps, records of Los Angeles County and the westerly prolongation of the northerly line of Lot 1 of said Tract, said intersection also being a point in the easterly boundary of the City of Hawthorne as same existed on June 1, 1960; thence easterly along said westerly prolongation and said northerly line to the northwest corner of Lot 25 of said Tract; thence, easterly and southerly following along the northerly and easterly lines of said last mentioned lot to the southeast corner

of said Lot 25; thence, southerly in a direct line to the northeast corner of Lot 15 of said Tract 15794; thence, southerly and westerly following along the easterly and southerly lines of said last mentioned Lot to the southwest corner of said Lot 15; thence, westerly along the south line of Lot 14 of said Tract 15794 and its westerly prolongation to said boundary of the City of Hawthorne; thence, northerly following said boundary to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2: The polls at said election shall be opened at 7:00 o'clock A. M. of the day herein fixed for the holding of said election and shall be kept open until 7:00 o'clock P. M. of the same day, when the polls shall be closed.

SECTION 3: Upon the ballots to be used at said election there shall be printed the words:

SHALL "HUDSON ANNEXATION" BE ANNEXED TO THE
CITY OF HAWTHORNE, CALIFORNIA?

Opposite these words there shall be printed the words "Yes" and "No" and to the right of each of these last two words there shall be a voting square. If an elector shall stamp a cross (+) in the voting square after the printed word "Yes" the vote of such elector shall be counted in favor of the annexation of the annexation of said territory to the City of Hawthorne, California; and if an elector shall stamp a cross (+) in the voting square after the printed word "No" the vote of such elector shall be counted against such annexation.

In all particulars not herein recited said election shall be held in conformity, as near as may be, with the laws of the State of California concerning general elections and with said Annexation Act of 1913.

SECTION 4: (a) For the purpose of said election there is hereby established in the territory described herein one (1) voting precinct, which shall include all of said territory, being a portion of County Voting Precinct "Moneta 26." The following is the polling place of said election precinct and the following named persons hereby are named officers of election and shall constitute the board of election for such election precinct:

Polling Place:	13013 Cordary Hawthorne, California
Inspector:	Mildrede A. Cathey, 13013 Cordary
Judges:	Eleanore G. Kovach, 13115 Cordary Alberta Mukri, 13000 Roselle

(b) For their services in connection with said election, said inspector shall receive \$18.00 and said judges \$15.00 each; and the person in possession of the polling place named herein shall receive for the use of such premises in connection with said election the sum of \$15.00.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk shall publish a notice of said special election as required by the Annexation Act of 1913, at least once a week for

four (4) weeks prior to the date of the election on July 11, 1961, in the Inglewood Daily News, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published outside of the City of Hawthorne, California, but in the County of Los Angeles, California.



The boundaries submitted do not create islands or corridors of unincorporated territory and conform with record lines.


