

By resolutions Nos. C-7228, C-7229 and C-7230 of the City of Long Beach, adopted August 8, 1939, petitioning the Board of Supervisors for annexation of certain territory; by resolution of said Board adopted September 5, 1939, approving the annexation; and by notice filed with the Secretary of State September 12, 1939, the following described territory was annexed:

Beginning at a point in the westerly line of said Lot 66 from which the northwest corner of said Lot 66 bears North  $0^{\circ}11'46.3''$  East for a distance of 1,495.51 feet, said point of beginning being in the boundary line of the City of Long Beach, as said boundary line was established by an annexation election of November 19, 1930; thence North  $89^{\circ}57'25''$  East a distance of 1,270.40 feet to a point in a line 10 feet westerly of, measured at right angles, and parallel to the easterly line of said Lot 66; thence South  $0^{\circ}11'58''$  West a distance of 657.26 feet, parallel to said easterly line of said Lot 66 and the easterly line of said Lot 67; thence South  $89^{\circ}57'25''$  West a distance of 1,270.36 feet to a point in said westerly line of said Lot 66, said point being in the boundary line of the City of Long Beach, as said boundary line was established by an annexation election of November 19, 1930; and thence North  $0^{\circ}11'46.3''$  East a distance of 657.26 feet along said westerly line of said Lot 66 to the point of beginning, said westerly line of Lot 66 being in said boundary line of the City of Long Beach.

C-7226, C-7229 and C-7230, respectively, adopted August 8, 1939, by the City Council of the City of Long Beach, being those portions of Tract No. 808<sup>4</sup> as shown on map recorded in Book 171, pages 24 to 30 inclusive, of Maps, records of the County of Los Angeles, described as "Parcel A", "Parcel B" and "Parcel C", respectively, in deed to the City of Long Beach (for air-port purposes), recorded in Book 16762, page 115, of Official Records of said county, further described in general as follows:

**Parcel 6-A:**

A parcel of land approximately 1500 feet long (extending northeast and southwest) and 300 feet wide, lying west of Lakewood Boulevard and north of the easterly extension of Wardlow Road.

**Parcel 6-B:**

A triangular shaped parcel of land of approximately 2.7 acres lying west of Lakewood Boulevard, and north of and adjacent to the easterly extension of Wardlow Road.
