

Certified Copy of Decree and Vacation of Appeal

Filed June 24, 1858

Descriptive notes of the Rancho Tajauta confirmed to E. Abila,
and conforming to the approval of said Rancho by the Honorable
Commissioner of the General Land Office of June 22, 1870

E Beginning at a point on the Northerly boundary of the Rancho
San Pedro confirmed to Manuel Dominguez, et al from which
point

A pile of stones, three in number, being Station No. 4
of said Rancho bears S 87° W, 45 chains and six links distant
thence (the variation of the magnetic needle being
13° 30' E)

North

320.14 chains to Station on line between Sections 28 and 33

Township 2 S. Range 13 W, 45 chains due E/^{from post} and charred stake
(Witness Corner) on line between Sections 29 and 32 of
Township before mentioned thence on a line between Sections
28 and 33

E

101 chains to post and charred stake

Station, and being also corner of the San Antonio Rancho
confirmed to Antonio Maria Lugo

thence along the Westerly boundary of the Rancho of San
Antonio aforesaid

S 5° 45' E

51.00 chains to quarter section post on the South boundary of Section 34

Township 2 S Range 13 W Station

Thence S 10° E

36.88 to a post and charred stake on Northerly edge of Swamp Station

Thence S 14° 05' W

41.38 To Station

Thence S 10° 11' E

35.00 To Station in center of swamp

Thence S 15° 19' E

36.00 to the Southerly edge of swamp Station.

Thence S 12° E

62.00 to post and charred stake Station at a place called Tijera
from which

The junction of the streams formerly the tijeras or
shears bears S 10° W 231 links distant

Thence leaving the San Antonio Rancho and along the Northerly
boundary of the Rancho San Pedro confirmed to Manuel Dominguez
et al

S 72° W

105.60 to a pile of stones Station, and being also Station "No. 3"
of the Rancho San Pedro; and

Thence S 87° W

36.04 to the point of beginning.

Containing 3559.86/100 of an acre and being designated upon
the maps of public surveys as Lot No. 39 Township 2 S. Range
13 W, and Lot No. 42 Township 3 S. Range 13 W of San
Bernardino Base and Meridian
