The City of Malibu's staff takes every opportunity possible to participate in planning, hosting, and/or attending local events to promote public environmental and water quality education. It is a perfect setting to provide educational materials and information to attendees, as well as be able to answer questions that the members of the public might have.

Some events that the City was involved in this past reporting year include California Coastal Cleanup Day, Ocean Friendly Garden Workshop, A Day Without a Bag (in partnership with Heal the Bay and local businesses), Smart Gardening Workshop, Earth Hour which led into Earth Month (a month long promotion of environmentally friendly and sustainable practices), two Earth Day Celebrations (at Pepperdine University and the City of Malibu's fair at Legacy Park), and a Water Quality Symposium. The Parks and Recreation Department also displays educational materials from the City's Environmental Programs Office (particularly materials which promote water quality protection) at events that may not have an environmental focus such as Malipalooza Music Festival and Chumash Day.

The City also participates in and hosts many regularly scheduled education events and activities as well. These events include Brush Clearance Recycling and Free Mulch Event, Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)/Used Oil Roundups, Free Bulky Item Disposal Day, Christmas Tree Recycling Event, and a quarterly Electronic Waste Recycling Collection. This year the City organized a document shredding recycle event for residents and businesses. These events are intended to reduce our community's impact on the environment, while providing multiple benefits such as preventing litter, illegal trash and hazardous materials dumping, reducing waste generated, and diverting waste from the landfill. The City also promotes other regional agencies' programs that provide useful services to the community such as the City of Calabasas' E-Waste Disposal Events and the County of Los Angeles' HHW events. Educational materials are available at all event sites.





Water Quality Symposium 2011



The 2011 Water Quality Symposium, 21st Century Science and Technology, promises to enlighten. Research projects that have taken many years and thousands of hours of analysis are ready for presentation. Subjects range from water quality source identification to the economics of sea level rise. This event will provide a unique opportunity to interact with recognized experts and researchers who have studied our rich coastal habitats. Please join us for a day of learning, exploration, and discussion.



Legacy Park Tour will commence immediately following the event and wrap up at approximately 5:30 p.m. The 17-acre park collects stormwater from the 337-acre Malibu Lagoon sub-watershed, disinfects with ozone in a 1,400 gallons per minute facility, and is recycled for park irrigation. The project includes restoration of five native habitats, a green street retrofit, trails, an outdoor classroom, and environmental education nodes.

The \$25.00 Registration Fee will include lunch. Seating is limited, so early registration is essential. 




BRUSH COLLECTION/MULCH

The City of Malibu provides a brush collection area for property owners doing wildfire fuel reduction on their property and is a free service to our residents. We can accept brush, limbs or trees up to eight inches in diameter. The brush is then chipped and piled as available mulch for anyone needing these materials on their property. The annual brush collection area is located at 29136 Pacific Coast Highway near Heathercliff Road.

We cannot accept Ice Plant (*Lampranthus*), palm fronds, pine needles, raked leaves, or invasive plants such as Castor Bean (*Ricinus communis*); grasses, straw, and hay will not be accepted because they are likely to be contaminated with weed seeds. These kinds of yard waste can be placed in your green waste bin for curbside collection.

Chipped mulch can be spread over bare soil to protect against erosion. These chips will also help to keep weeds and grass from growing in these areas. Mulches reduce the growth of weeds, when the mulch material itself is weed-free and applied deeply enough to prevent weed germination or to smother existing weeds. In addition to suppressing weed growth, mulch conserves soil moisture, moderates soil temperature, and prevents soil compaction. Spreading mulch around trees and shrubs reduces landscape maintenance and keeps plants healthy.

Mulches can add to the beauty of the landscape by providing a cover of uniform color and interesting texture to the surface. Chips should be large enough so that they do not blow around in a strong wind and should be spread to a thickness of not more than six inches. The ideal time of the year to apply mulch is late spring/early summer after the soil has warmed.

BUSINESS WASTE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

What you CAN bring to an event (examples):

- Brake fluid, paint, paint thinner, cleaners with acid or lye, pesticides or herbicides, household batteries and car batteries, pool chemicals, motor oil, oil filters, expired pharmaceuticals, anti-freeze, and fluorescent light bulbs.
- Household electronic waste which includes: Computer monitors, televisions, computer CPUs, keyboards, printers, cellular phones, etc.


What you CAN'T bring to an event:

- Hazardous waste and electronic waste from businesses.
- Explosives, ammunition and radioactive materials.
- Trash and tires.
- White goods such as refrigerators, stoves and washing machines, etc.
- Controlled substances.

How to prepare items for transportation:

- Bring the items in a sturdy box, preferably in their original labeled containers.
- Do not mix the items together.
- There is a limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste per trip.
- Be prepared to leave your containers and boxes. Remove all other items from your trunk.


