


**Los Angeles County Municipal Storm Water Permit (Order 01-182)

During the 2011-12 Fiscal Year, as part of the City's Outdoor Education Program, the City conducted Storm Water Pollution Prevention presentations to the Monrovia Unified School District between September 2010 and April 2011.




The presentation incorporates an Enviroscape Model to assist in covering an overall environmental message on pollution prevention, including impacts of storm drain pollution on the environment. The presentation was revised as the result of present knowledge of impacts of storm water pollution demonstrated by the young children during the previous year. The revised program covers information of solid waste reductions, recycling,

storm water pollution prevention and water conservation. As many of the pollutants, trash, etc., and pollution prevention practices (recycling, etc.) assist with eliminating pollutants to the storm drain systems, this revision to the program was appropriate.

As part of the City's **litter prevention campaign**, reusable water bottles and reusable shopping bag use is promoted at City event and provided to event attendees. In the past, reusable water bottles and bags were provided; however, since these items were purchased with State grant money, the City is unable to distribute at this time (due to State issued SWAG policy).

The City participated in **regional advertisements** with the City of Bradbury, Sierra Madre and Arcadia. The advertisements ran in each of the City's Weeklies (Monrovia Weekly, Arcadia Weekly, etc.).



Recycle Used Oil & Filters!

Do you change your car's motor oil? Did you know that used oil and oil filters are recyclable? Used oil can be re-refined or processed into new motor oil. Currently only 46% of used motor oil is being recycled, which means 20 million gallons may be illegally entering California's waterways via stormwater systems posing a great risk to the environment. One gallon of used oil can contaminate a million gallons of drinking water; polluting our waterways and threaten fish and aquatic life. Prevent pollution; recycle used motor oil and filters!

Reduced pesticides, proper fertilizer usage, water saving measures, and use of compost in lieu of chemical fertilizers is promoted through the City's sponsorship of LA County's Smart Gardening Program. The City hosted 1 **Smart Gardening Workshop**, Fall and Spring, this past year. "Smart Gardening" information is also provided at many of the City's events as well as on the City's web page.

To help promote proper disposal of hazardous materials, the City hosted a County-wide **HHW Collection Event** on March 3, 2012. Additionally, throughout the year, we advertise the City's free curbside HHW and E-waste collection program, County HHW collection events and SAFE Center locations.

Used oil recycling advertisements were also presented as part of the joint adds. Recycling kits are offered free to residents at special events and at the City Hall and Public Works front counter.
