












Public Works' Role in Solid Waste



- Solid waste collection
- Recycling programs
- Disposal capacity planning
- Facility permitting
- Outreach and assistance



What is Organic Waste?

- All Food
- Food scraps
- Food soiled paper
- Landscaping waste
- Wood
- Manure
- Organic textiles









A Statewide Law

Senate Bill 1383 (2016) - Short-lived Climate Pollutants (SLCP): Organic Waste Reductions

- CalRecycle Statewide Regulations to reduce methane emissions
- Methane is 86 times more powerful than carbon dioxide
- Regulations require 75% reduction of organic waste disposal by 2025 and recovery of excess edible food
- New requirements are effective January 1, 2022





Los Angeles County's Ordinance



Purpose of the Organic Waste Ordinance

- Reduce disposal of organic waste and its impact on the environment
- Comply with CalRecycle's requirements with SB 1383

Ordinance Summary

- Require organic waste collection service for everyone
- Establish self-hauler requirements
- Require large edible food generating business to recover/donate excess edible food
- Establish reporting requirements for Edible Food Recovery Organizations
- Establish enforcement procedures such as correction notices and penalties

Edible Food Recovery

What do Edible Food Generators need to do to comply?

Have an agreement with a food recovery agency to accept their excess food

Tier 1 Edible Food Generators - need to comply by 2022

- Supermarkets
- Grocery Stores (Facilities ≥ 10,000 sq.ft.)
- Food Service Providers
- Food Distributors
- Wholesale Food Vendors

Tier 2 Edible Food Generators - need to comply by 2024

- Restaurants (250+ seats or facilities ≥ 5,000 sq.ft.)
- Hotels (on-site food facility and 200+ rooms)
- Health facilities (on-site food facility and 100+ beds)
- Large venues
- Large events
