New Facility Ancillary Services Master
Agreement (FASMA) for waste Hauling

Los Angeles County facilities can now request to subscribe to source-separated food waste, green waste, and recyclables collection services through the Internal Services Department arranged by the new FASMA. Recycling reduces landfill disposal and lowers emissions of harmful greenhouse gases that cause climate change. Recycled waste can be used to create new products, clean energy, renewable fuel, compost or other soil amendments. The new waste collection services are available at an additional monthly cost. Paper and Carboard Recycling

In 2008, Los Angeles County adopted a Board Motion which directs County departments to purchase paper with at least 30 percent recycled content, implement paper and beverage recycling services, and establish paper collection agreements. Work with your department's procurement staff or contact Internal Services Department at (323) 267-2205 to administer paper and carboard services.


Paper recycling tips:

- Reuse both sides of your paper as scratch paper.
- Remove paper clips, binder clips, and tape.
- Set printer for double-sided printing.

Cardboard recycling tips:

- Reuse your cardboard. If it cannot be reused, break it down and put it in the cardboard recycling bin.
- Remove any attachments, such as tape.
- Do not recycle food contaminated cardboard.

Maximizing your Office Sustainability

At your desk:

- Keep a recycling bin nearby.
- Use both sides of your papers.
- Print only when necessary.

In the break room:

- Practice "Bring Your Own."

- Give paperless presentations.
