ANTELOPE VALLEY RESIDENTS

TO PARTICIPATE IN READING

AND RECYCLING PROGRAM



The Antelope Valley Illegal Dumping Task Force, Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich, and Waste Management are partnering together to bring the "Book Reuse and Recycling Drive" to the Antelope Valley.

Residents are encouraged to bring their unwanted books to select locations throughout the Antelope Valley. Unusable books will be recycled while the remaining books will be donated to various County library locations in the AV as well as the new County Bookmobile initiated by Supervisor Antonovich. The books will be added to their collections or sold to help support the needs of the libraries.

Nearly 50 million tons of paper, including books, are disposed of in landfills each year. A large portion of reusable books are also found illegally dumped in the desert.

"Participation in this program will help keep our valley beautiful, save landfill space and support our local libraries," said Supervisor Antonovich.

AV residents can drop off their books for free at the following locations. All books will be accepted including children's, fiction, non-fiction, comic books, magazines, etc.

Los Angeles County residents are invited to properly dispose of household hazardous waste and electronic waste (HHW/E-Waste) at a free Countywide Household Hazardous Waste Roundup on:

Items accepted at our Roundups include unused pharmaceuticals, sharps waste, antifreeze, car batteries, used motor oil, paint, pesticides, household batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, TVs, computers, VCRs, stereos, and cell phones. Residents can bring up to 15 gallons or 125 pounds of household hazardous waste per vehicle to the Roundup.

It's a great opportunity to clean out your garage and clean up the environment. Our free drive-thru, drop-off events are a quick, convenient, and a common-sense way to dispose of materials too toxic to trash, pour down a sink, or dump in a storm drain.
