STOP ILLEGAL DUMPING

- Disposing of your own waste properly and spreading the word to friends and neighbors that illegal dumping is a crime
- Securing debris transported in the back of your vehicle by using a tarp or cover
- Participating in clean-ups of vacant lots and sites used for illegal dumping
- Supporting recycling programs in your community

County of Los Angeles

Unincorporated County residents can drop off one bulky item per year at the Lancaster Landfill, free of charge.

City of Palmdale

Palmdale residents can have a maximum of 4 bulky items collected each week. Call Waste Management at (661) 947-7197 to schedule.

City of lancaster

Lancaster residents can have a maximum of 4 bulky item pickups per year with up to 4 bulky items collected each time. Call Waste Management at (661) 947-7197 to schedule.



The Sharps Disposal by Mail System allows home users to dispose of sharps by mailing them to a resource recovery facility. For information, call (877) WASTE MD or visit www.wastemd.com. rre Recyding Unincorporated County residents can annually drop off up to four waste tires free of charge at the Lancaster Landfill.

The Lancaster and Antelope Valley Landfills will accept tires for a nominal fee.



Smart Gardening Workshops



The Smart Gardening workshop provides all residents with information regarding backyard and worm composting, grass recycling, water-wise gardening, fire-wise gardening, and other waste reduction tips related to gardening. Free Trash Disposal Days Unincorporated County residents can take up to 1 ton of trash to the Lancaster and Antelope Valley Landfills on "Free Dump Day," held in April and October.

Palmdale residents can place up to 8 extra bags at curbside during AV Environmental Pride Week in April. Residents will also receive two free landfill vouchers per year. Lancaster residents can take up to 1 ton of trash to the Lancaster Landfill for "Free Dump Day," usually during AV Environmental Pride Week in April.

Household Hazardous/ Electronic Waste The Antelope Valley Environmental Collection Center allows all residents to drop off household hazardous and electronic waste free of charge. The center, located at the Antelope Valley Landfill, 1200 W. City Ranch Road, in Palmdale, is open the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Residents can also drop off their cell phones at the Antelope Valley Transit Authority or with any AVTA bus driver.

Lancaster and Palmdale city residents may arrange for a free pick-up of used oil and oil filters at their doorstep by calling (800)449-7587.
