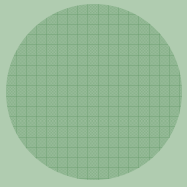
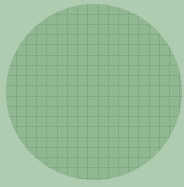


# UPDATE ON CIWMB STRATEGIC DIRECTIVES – REVIEW OF TASK FORCE COMMENTS

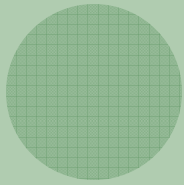
# CIWMB STRATEGIC DIRECTIVES

- ◎ SD-8: Enforcement/Permitting
- ◎ SD-9: Research and Development of Technology
- ◎ SD-10: Fiduciary Responsibility
- ◎ SD-11: Public Outreach and Environmental Education
- ◎ SD-12: Training and Development



# STRATEGIC DIRECTIVE TIMELINE

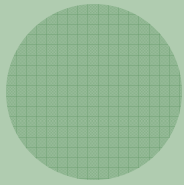
- ◎ **February 2007** - Board adopted initial set of Strategic Directives
- ◎ **July 2007** - Board requested staff to provide baseline, performance measures, and key activities for the Strategic Directives
- ◎ **February 2008** - Board approved revisions updating the Strategic Directives to reflect the current status of specific activities
- ◎ **March 2008** - The Board adopted revised Strategic Directives
- ◎ **May 2009** - new Strategic Directive 2 on Waste Management and Climate Change added
- ◎ **November 2009** – Staff made annual progress presentation and discussed annual targets and key activities for CIWMB's Strategic Directives

## Mandatory Commercial Recycling

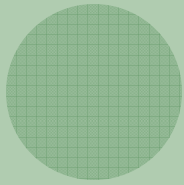

<b>Draft</b> Promulgate a rule making for a mandatory commercial recycling scoping plan measure by 12/31/10, and link this effort with the CIWMB's efforts to support local government and business diversion and climate change programs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•Complete environmental and economic lifecycle assessment needed since materials sent to Pacific Rim Countries</li><li>•Need for in-state markets for use of recycled products</li><li>•Mandatory commercial recycling adds financial burden to local government</li></ul>

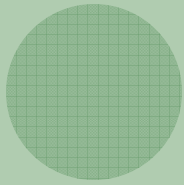

<b>Final</b> <b><u>No Change</u></b>	

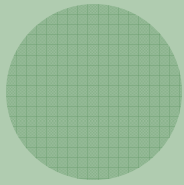

<b>Draft</b> Foster the development of alternative energy and biofuels derived from waste materials after high-values recyclables have been removed, and continuing to play an active role in the Bioenergy Interagency Group	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• define the word “foster”</li><li>• Change language to “play an active role in the Bioenergy Interagency Working Group and the Alternative Technology Advisory Subcommittee of the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force</li></ul>
<b>Final</b> <u><b>Key activity added:</b></u> <u><b>• Assist Los Angeles City and County on bioenergy projects, ongoing</b></u>	

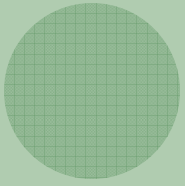

# TASK FORCE COMMENTS ON SD-6

CIWMB	Task Force Comments – July 7, 2009
<b>Draft</b> Reduce the amount of organics in the waste stream by 50% by 2010	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• define the terms “compostable” and “organic”</li><li>• Change definitions to reflect definitions provided in August 2008 letter to Task Force</li></ul>
<b>Final</b>	
<b><u>No change</u></b>	The Waste Board acknowledged TF concerns at meeting on 11/17 and would respond because it was asked in writing; however, changes to SDs at this point are not under consideration
