# UPDATE ON CIWMB STRATEGIC DIRECTIVES - REVIEW OF TASK FORCE COMMENTS

### STRATEGIC DIRECTIVE TIMELINE

- February 2007 Board adopted initial set of Strategic Directives
- <u>July 2007</u> Board requested staff to provide baseline, performance measures, and key activities for the Strategic Directives
- <u>February 2008</u> Board approved revisions updating the Strategic Directives to reflect the current status of specific activities
- March 2008 The Board adopted revised Strategic Directives
- May 2009 new Strategic Directive 2 on Waste Management and Climate Change added
- November 2009 Staff made annual progress presentation and discussed annual targets and key activities for CIWMB's Strategic Directives
