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Background

Requirements for Organic Waste Recycling Capacity Planning – Countywide

- 1) Estimate the amount of organic waste that will be disposed
- 2) Identify existing organic waste recycling capacity infrastructure (in and out of the County) that is verifiably available
- Estimate the amount of needed organic waste recycling facility capacity
- 4) Consult with the Local Enforcement Agency & Local Task Force on the status of locations for new or expanded facilities

Requirements for Organic Waste Recycling Capacity Planning

- Conduct community outreach regarding locations considered for new or expanded facilities
- 6) Consult with community composting operators to estimate amount of organic waste that will be handled
- 7) Notify any jurisdiction or jurisdictions (within the County) that lack sufficient capacity to submit an implementation schedule to CalRecycle

Requirements for Edible Food Capacity Planning - Countywide

- 1) Estimate the amount of edible food that will be disposed by commercial food generators
- 2) Identify existing available capacity at edible food recovery organizations
- Identify proposed new or expanded edible food recovery organizations
- 4) Identify the amount of capacity needed at edible food recovery organizations to recover 20% of the edible food that is estimated to be disposed
- 5) Notify any jurisdiction or jurisdictions (within the County) that lack sufficient capacity to submit an implementation schedule to CalRecycle

Preliminary Task Strategy for Complying with Requirements



- Coordinate Implementation Plan with 89 jurisdictions in the County, waste industry, and other stakeholders
- Create database/website portal to collect data and communicate with the cities
- Send letters to the cities explaining the SB 1383 requirements for capacity planning
- Hold follow-up meetings/workshops with cities to explain how database functions
- Roll-out new database for collection of data from cities
- Send monthly reminders about required data submission





2019 Organic Waste Management Plan Annual Report

- Mechanism for Countywide Reporting & Compliance Strategy will be the Organic Plan Annual Report
- Survey of Facilities
- AB 876 compliance & SB 1383 planning to prepare for 2022 requirements
- SB 1383 compliance dates

August 1, 2022: Report to CalRecycle on period covering January 1, 2022 - December 31, 2024
