SB 1383 - COMPLIANCE PROCESS

- Starting on January 1, 2022, jurisdictions in California are required to implement SB 1383, the Short-Lived Climate Pollutants Reduction Act
- The Act requires that all jurisdictions:
 - have organics collection in place beginning in January 2022.
 - provide service to all residential generators
 - Jurisdictions and food establishments are required to implement food waste prevention programs to donate unsold food

SB 1383 ENFORCEMENT PROCESS TIMELINE



- Potential compliance assistance for up to three years.
- Enforcement for non-responsiveness/non-compliance.

SB 619 ORGANIC WASTE: REDUCTION REGULATIONS: LOCAL JURISDICTION COMPLIANCE

 SB 619 (Laird, 2021) singed into law allows jurisdictions to submit a Notification of Intent to Comply (<u>NOIC</u>) to CalRecycle by March 1, 2022.

- Provides jurisdictions relief from civil penalties for calendar year 2022,
 - Jurisdictions will be required to provide a justification for why they will be out of compliance,
 - Submit a list of action items the jurisdiction will take to come into compliance, and
 - Provide a timeline to implement them.

NOTIFICATION OF INTENT TO COMPLY AND RESOLUTION

NOIC

- Detailed description of the continuing violations
- 2. Detailed explanation of the reasons why the jurisdiction is unable to comply.
- 3. A description of the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on compliance.
- 4. A description of the proposed actions the jurisdiction will take to remedy the violations
 - The proposed actions shall be tailored to remedy the violations in a timely manner.

Resolution

■ The governing body of a jurisdictions shall adopt a resolution affirming the contents and timeline of its Notification of Intent to Comply in order to avoid administrative civil penalties under PRC section 145652.5(a)(1) and (5).
