Re: Chiquita Canyon, LLC's Thirty-Second Monthly Update

Dear Members of the Integrated Waste Management Task Force:

Chiquita Canyon, LLC ("Chiquita") received a letter from the Integrated Waste Management Task Force (the "Task Force") dated April 19, 2021. The Task Force's letter requests that Chiquita provide monthly updates concerning a Notice of Violation ("NOV") that the County of Los Angeles Department of Regional Planning ("DRP") issued to Chiquita on June 11, 2020. The NOV alleges non-compliance with Conditions 68, 77, 79 and 113 of Chiquita's Conditional Use Permit ("CUP"). Chiquita previously provided monthly updates to the Task Force from April 2021 through October 2023. This letter serves as Chiquita's thirty-second monthly update.

On December 2, 2021, the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works ("PW") requested that these monthly updates include additional details concerning any NOVs issued by regulatory agencies and Chiquita's actions to mitigate those NOVs. This letter provides additional details concerning the NOVs issued since the 31st Monthly Update letter and Chiquita's actions to mitigate those NOVs.

On August 15, 2022, PW requested that these monthly updates clearly indicate whether or not Chiquita received an NOV from any regulatory agencies during the reporting month and, if so, that Chiquita include a copy of the NOV as an attachment to the letter. Since the last monthly update, Chiquita received ten NOVs from the South Coast Air Quality Management District ("SCAQMD") for alleged violations of SCAQMD Rule 402 and Health & Safety Code section 41700 dated from November 2 to 29, 2023. Copies of these NOVs are enclosed in Attachment A. On November 15, 2023, SCAQMD issued Chiquita an NOV dated October 5, 2023 for alleged

violations of SCAQMD Rules 221(a), 1150(b)(2), and 3002(c)(1) as well as provisions of Chiquita's Title V Permit and Permit to Operate G43917. A copy of this NOV is provided at Attachment B. On November 16, 2023, SCAQMD issued Chiquita an NOV dated October 6, 2023 for alleged violations of SCAQMD Rules 3002(c)(1) and 430(b)(1) as well as provisions of Chiquita's Title V Permit and Permit to Operate G66132. A copy of this NOV is provided at Attachment C. On November 22, 2023, the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board ("RWQCB") issued Chiquita an NOV for alleged violations of waste discharge requirements ("WDRs") Order No. R4-2018-0172 and a Monitoring and Reporting Program. A copy of this NOV is provided at Attachment D.

On October 16, 2023, the Facility and Plan Review Subcommittee requested that these monthly updates include a detailed update on the status of Chiquita's compliance with its Stipulated Order for Abatement with SCAQMD and any other mitigation measures imposed by other regulatory agencies. Detailed information on Chiquita's implementation of the Stipulated Order can be found in the chart enclosed as Attachment E.

June 2020 DRP NOV

Chiquita has reached a settlement agreement with the County of Los Angeles (the "County"), which includes terms affecting Conditions 77 and 79. This settlement agreement was approved by the County Board of Supervisors on October 11, 2022. The settlement agreement requires Chiquita to submit an application to modify its CUP consistent with the terms of the settlement agreement. Those terms include proposed modifications to Conditions 77 and 79. Chiquita submitted the required CUP modification application on November 10, 2022. The hearing on the June 2020 NOV is stayed pending the outcome of this CUP modification process.

Chiquita continues to work on securing the permits and approvals required to begin construction on the new entrance along Wolcott Way under Conditions 77 and 79. Chiquita has provided updates on the June 11, 2020 NOV and Conditions 77 and 79 during previous meetings of the Chiquita Canyon Landfill Community Advisory Committee (the "CAC"). A link to these previous meetings and meeting materials summarizing the status of Chiquita's implementation of activities related to Conditions 77 and 79 can be found on DRP's website, here https://planning.lacounty.gov/public-hearings-and-meetings/chiquita-canyon-landfill/community-advisory-committee/. Chiquita is happy to continue to provide these updates at future CAC meetings if requested.

SCAOMD Rule 402 NOVs

The SCAQMD Rule 402 NOVs were issued due to odors that allegedly emanated from the Chiquita Canyon Landfill (the "Landfill"). The source of any odors coming from the Landfill is a

large and unexpected increase in the production of landfill gas and liquids at the Landfill. This increase in landfill gas and liquids production is due to an abnormal biotic or abiotic process (a reaction) taking place within a portion of the Landfill waste mass. Chiquita has retained a toxicologist to review air monitoring data and, based on August and September 2023 air monitoring data, no adverse health effects are anticipated across the community. More information on the landfill reaction, recent air monitoring data, and analyses from Chiquita's toxicologists can be found on Chiquita's website.

On September 6, 2023, Chiquita entered into a Stipulated Order for Abatement with the SCAQMD to address the SCAQMD Rule 402 NOVs issued by SCAQMD inspectors as a result of the landfill reaction. The Stipulated Order contains both short-term and long-term measures designed to slow the underlying reaction and mitigate the impacts felt in the community. More information on Chiquita's implementation of the Stipulated Order can be found in Chiquita's monthly reports to the SCAQMD, which are posted the Odor Mitigation page of Chiquita's website, here: https://chiquitacanyon.com/reports/odor-mitigation/.

In September 2020, Chiquita submitted a permit application to SCAQMD for a new flare that would allow the Landfill to better control the increasing quantity of gas. On September 28, 2023, after SCAQMD and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency review, Chiquita received the permit from SCAQMD. On October 10, 2023, Chiquita received the new flare onsite. Chiquita put the new flare into operation on November 15, and notified SCAQMD on November 17, as required by the Stipulated Order. Additional information on Chiquita's compliance with the conditions of the Stipulated Order is provided in Attachment E.

October 5, 2023 SCAQMD NOV

The October 5 SCAQMD NOV alleges, among other things, that Chiquita is excavating the Landfill without an approved Excavation Management Plan. The activities forming the basis for this NOV are a portion of the corrective action that Chiquita is taking to mitigate the impacts of the reaction and address the leachate violations noted in the September 19, 2023 LEA Site Inspection Report discussed in the 31st Monthly Update letter. Specifically, pressure from excess gas and liquids caused a portion of the western slope of the reaction area to move off of the landfill liner. This also caused leachate seeps to reach the concrete stormwater channels. Chiquita has conducted construction and repair work to remove any waste that was off of the landfill liner, reconstruct the slope, and redirect leachate seepage so that it remains fully on the lined area of the Landfill and flows into a new sump area for prompt collection and offsite disposal. The lower portion of the western slope is now covered with a temporary scrim (temporary cover). Chiquita is in the process of cleaning the stormwater channels, and no leachate reached the facility's stormwater pond. Chiquita performed this construction and repair work in order to comply with LEA regulations and under LEA oversight and jurisdiction. Chiquita is discussing this NOV with SCAQMD and will further address this NOV based on the results of that discussion.

October 6, 2023 SCAQMD NOV

The October 6 SCAQMD NOV alleges that Chiquita is failing to maintain its leachate collection and storage system in good operating condition, is failing to prevent landfill gas condensate vapors from entering the atmosphere, and failed to report a breakdown or malfunction of the leachate collection and storage system within one hour. The factual bases underlying this NOV are unclear to Chiquita. Chiquita is discussing this NOV with SCAQMD to better understand the alleged violations. Chiquita will address this NOV based on the results of that discussion. To the extent this NOV is based on the recent leachate seeps observed at the Landfill, as described in more detail in Chiquita's 31st Monthly Update letter, Chiquita is implementing several mitigation measures to address these leachate seeps, including the construction and repair work on the west side of the Landfill, improving the Landfill's dewatering capacity, and redirecting excess liquids into the Landfill's leachate collection and storage system.

November 22, 2023 RWQCB NOV

The November 22 RWQCB NOV alleges that Chiquita failed to prevent the commingling of leachate and gas condensate with surface water during rain events and failed to report a leachate seep as required by Chiquita's WDRs. To address the commingling issue, as part of the construction work described above, Chiquita has redirected the leachate that was reaching the stormwater channels and is cleaning those channels. Chiquita has also installed an earthen stormwater control berm along the top of the scrim that redirects stormwater away from the area with leachate seeps so that it does not commingle with leachate. As required by the NOV, Chiquita is preparing a formal written response to the RWQCB by December 22, 2023.

Chiquita looks forward to continuing to provide the Task Force with updates on the June 11. 2020 NOV and any NOVs issued by regulatory agencies. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

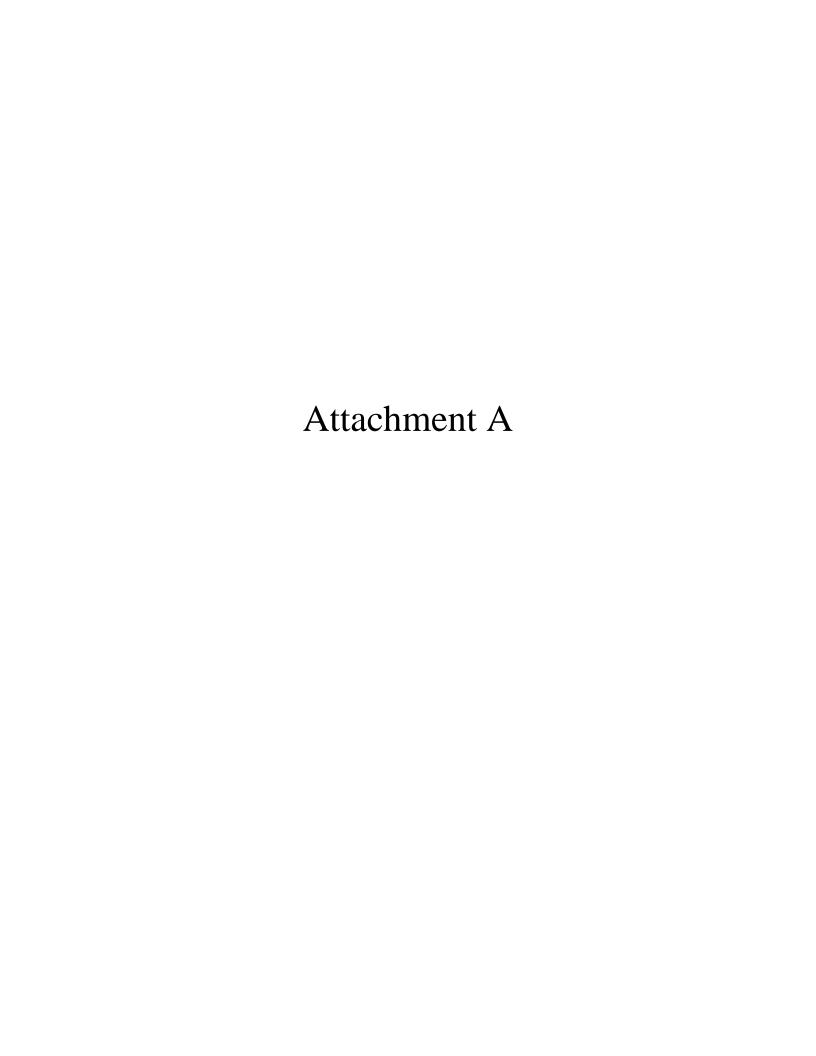



If you are operating in violation of one or more applicable federal, state, and/or local (SCAQMD) air pollution rules and regulations or legal requirements, each day or part of a day that you operate in violation is considered a separate violation even if only one Notice of Violation has been issued. Continuing to operate in violation may subject you to substantial civil or criminal penalties. It is in your best interest to resolve any compliance problem immediately before you resume operation.

What if I need to continue to operate the equipment named in the Notice of Violation?

If continued operation of equipment cited in the Notice of Violation is necessary, you may be able to obtain a variance from SCAQMD's Hearing Board. A *variance* is an administrative order that allows a company to continue operating without penalties while it takes appropriate steps to meet air pollution control requirements. Proof of specific legal circumstances must be provided before a variance can be granted. Timeliness in seeking such relief will be considered by the Hearing Board. If your case is handled by this program, you will receive a letter or phone call from an investigator in the SCAQMD General Counsel's office offering to settle your violation. Settlement terms usually call for a penalty payment and written proof of current compliance. The investigator's name and telephone number are included in the initial settlement letter in the event you would like to discuss the case.

Be prepared to describe any facts about the violation that you believe SCAQMD should know in considering your case. Sharing your knowledge of the facts, possible causes for the violation and plans to avoid future violations will help the investigator arrive at an appropriate disposition.

Be sure to respond by the date indicated in the letter to avoid further legal action.

If the Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program fails to result in a settlement, your Notice of Violation may be referred to an SCAQMD attorney and handled under the procedures for Civil Prosecution or resolved through a Small Claims Court.

• Civil Prosecution

If your case is handled as a civil matter, it will be reviewed by an attorney from the SCAQMD General Counsel's office, who will typically make first contact with you through a letter that asks for information about your case. If the allegations in the Notice of Violation cannot be informally resolved, the SCAQMD is authorized to file a civil lawsuit in court to recover civil penalties. In cases involving serious harm or danger, however, SCAQMD may immediately commence a legal action for civil penalties and a court-ordered injunction. A mandatory injunction is a court order compelling a person and/or company to take specific action. A prohibitory injunction is a court order compelling a person and/or company to refrain from taking a specific action. Injunctions, which may even lead to shutting down a business, may be sought by SCAQMD to prevent continuing or serious violations or damages from occurring.

Criminal Prosecution

If SCAQMD determines that criminal prosecution is appropriate, the case will be referred to the appropriate state or federal law enforcement agency. That agency will determine if criminal prosecution is warranted.





NOTICE OF VIOLATION OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – CHIQUITA CANYON LANDFILL, CASTAIC, CALIFORNIA (FILE NO. 67-020, ORDER NO. R4-2018-0172, GEOTRACKER GLOBAL ID. L10003464243)

Dear Steve Cassulo:

The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Los Angeles Water Board) is the public agency with primary responsibility for the protection of ground and surface water quality within major portions of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties. The Los Angeles Water Board hereby issues this notice of violation (NOV) to Waste Connections, Inc. (Discharger), which operates the Chiquita Canyon Landfill (Landfill), a Class III municipal solid waste landfill located at 29201 Henry Mayo Drive, Castaic, California.

The Landfill is regulated under waste discharge requirements (WDRs) Order No. R4-2018-0172, including a Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP, CI 6231), adopted by the Los Angeles Water Board on December 13, 2018, for the discharge of municipal solid wastes. The WDRs include requirements for construction and operations activities at the Landfill to protect groundwater and surface water resources of the State.

On October 3, 2023, during an inspection of the Landfill following a complaint by the Los Angeles County (LAC) Local Enforcement Agency (LEA), Los Angeles Water Board staff observed a leachate seep in the north-western portion of Main Canyon of the Landfill that flowed from the edge of the Landfill to a concrete V-ditch. The V-ditch widens to a flat bottomed ditch on its course to the stormwater debris basin at the front of the Landfill. The Landfill Operator placed several soil berms along the flat-bottomed ditch to capture and pump off the leachate before it reached the debris basin. Observations made during the inspection are documented in the enclosed inspection report. During a joint site visit conducted by multiple regulatory agencies on November 2, 2023, the Los Angeles Water Board staff observed that the above mentioned leachate seep was still occurring.

Section F.6 of the WDRs requires that "Leachate and landfill-gas condensate containment systems shall be protected and maintained continuously to ensure their effectiveness and to prevent commingling of leachate and gas condensate with surface water run-on and run-off." The current conditions in the area of the leachate seep at the Landfill are not adequate to prevent the commingling of leachate and gas condensate with surface water run-on and run-off during a rain event.
- 2. Section B.3.a of the MRP requires that "The Discharger shall, within 24 hours of discovery, report to Regional Board staff by telephone or email any previously unreported seepage from the Landfill. A written report shall be filed with the Regional Board pursuant to electronic submittal of information (ESI) reporting requirements within seven days, and contain at least the following information: i. Map A map showing the location(s) of seepage. ii. Flow rate- An estimate of the flow rate. iii. Description A description of the nature of the discharge (e.g., all pertinent observations and analyses). iv. Location Location of sample(s) collected for laboratory analysis, as appropriate. v. Corrective measures approved (or proposed for consideration) by the Regional Board Executive Officer." The Landfill Operator failed to report the leachate seep observed at the Landfill during the inspection to the Los Angeles Water Board as required in the WDRs.

You are directed to immediately correct the above cited violations of the WDRs. By **December 22**, **2023**, the Discharger shall submit a written response to the Los Angeles Water Board to report all corrective actions that have been taken and actions that are planned to mitigate conditions of the Landfill that are in violation of the WDRs. No later than **February 20**, **2024**, the Discharger shall submit a final report to the Los Angeles Water Board to demonstrate that the Landfill complies with the WDRs.

Compliance with the terms of the MRP included in the WDRs is required by California Water Code (CWC) section 13267. Pursuant to CWC section 13268, a person's failure to furnish technical or monitoring program reports as required may be subject to administrative civil liability of up to \$1,000 for each day a report is missing after the required deadline. For violations of the WDRs, pursuant to the California Water Code section 13350(e), you are subject to penalties of up to \$5,000 for each day in which the violations occur or \$10 for each gallon of waste discharged, but not both. These administrative civil liabilities may be assessed by the Los Angeles Water Board beginning with the date that the violations first occurred and without further warning. Please note that this Notice shall not be deemed to relieve you of liability for any violations that may have already occurred. The Los Angeles Water Board reserves the right to take any further enforcement action authorized by law, including referring this matter to the Attorney General's Office.


