LOS ANGELES COUNTY INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT TASK FORCE ASSEMBLY BILL 939
ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS

RECOMMENDATIONS

That your Board introduce and approve the enclosed ordinance amending Title 3, Chapter 3.67, of the Los Angeles County Code regarding the designation of the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee as the Los Angeles County Integrated Waste Management Task Force.

BACKGROUND

On February 27, 1990, your Board instructed the Director of Public Works to work with the cities in the County in designating the County Solid Waste Management Committee as the County Integrated Waste Management Task Force pursuant to the recently enacted Assembly Bill 939. As of June 21, 1990, 77 cities, representing 96 percent of the County population, have approved the Task Force membership profile. The enclosed table summarizes the action by each city.

Therefore, having received the required approval from the majority of the cities within the County containing the majority of the County population, it is recommended that your Board approve the enclosed Ordinance amending Title 3 of the County Code, Chapter 3.67, designating the County Solid Waste Management Committee as the County Integrated Waste Management Task Force. The enclosed Ordinance has been approved as to form by County Counsel.

Upon adoption of the recommendation contained herein, please provide two copies of the adopted letter and all enclosures to the Department of Public Works, Waste Management Division.

This ordinance will designate the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee as the Los Angeles County Integrated Waste Management Task Force for the purpose of assisting in the development of the County Integrated Waste Management Plan.

ORDINANCE NO. 90-0096

An ordinance amending Title 3 of the Los Angeles County
Code relating to solid waste management. This ordinance
will designate the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management
Committee as the Los Angeles County Integrated Waste
Management Task Force for the purpose of assisting in the
development of the County Integrated Waste Management Plan.

The Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 3.67.020 of Title 3 of the Los Angeles County Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 3.67.020. Membership. The Los Angeles County solid waste management committee consists of the following 17 voting members: County engineer Director of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works (ex officio); the county health officer (ex officio); the chief engineer and general manager, Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (ex officio); the air pollution control officer, South Coast Air Quality Management District (ex officio); the director, bureau of sanitation, city of Los Angeles (ex officio); director of public service works, city of Long Beach (ex officio); three members appointed by the Los Angeles County Division of the League of California Cities; three members appointed by the city of Los Angeles; one member appointed by the Greater Los Angeles Solid Waste Management Association (GLASWMA); one member appointed by the local chapter of the National Association of Recycling Industries (NARI)

Institute of Scrap Recycling Industries (ISRI); and three

mental organization and business appointed by the board of supervisors. All members shall be residents of the county.

Section 2. Section 3.67.060 of Title 3 of the Los Angeles County Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 3.67.060 Officers. The Chairperson shall be the Director of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works or his duly-appointed representative county engineer. The committee shall elect a vice-chairperson from the membership for a one-year term, and that individual shall not serve more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. Section 3.67.090 of Title 3 of the Los Angeles County Code is added to read as follows:

Section 3.67.090. Los Angeles County Integrated Waste

Management Task Force. The Los Angeles County Solid Waste

Management Committee is designated as the Los Angeles County

Integrated Waste Management Task Force.

Section 4. Section 3.67.100 of Title 3 of the Los Angeles County Code is added to read as follows:

Section 3.67.100. Purpose and Responsibilities. The
Los Angeles County Integrated Waste Management Task Force
is created pursuant to Public Resources Code Section
40000 et seq. for the purpose of assisting in coordinating the development of city source reduction and
recycling elements and performing the other duties set forth
in Public Resources Code Section 40950.
