Re: Chiquita Canyon, LLC's Thirty-Fourth Monthly Update

Dear Members of the Integrated Waste Management Task Force:

Chiquita Canyon, LLC ("Chiquita") received a letter from the Integrated Waste Management Task Force (the "Task Force") dated April 19, 2021. The Task Force's letter requests that Chiquita provide monthly updates concerning a Notice of Violation ("NOV") that the County of Los Angeles Department of Regional Planning ("DRP") issued to Chiquita on June 11, 2020. The NOV alleges non-compliance with Conditions 68, 77, 79 and 113 of Chiquita's Conditional Use Permit ("CUP"). Chiquita previously provided monthly updates to the Task Force from April 2021 through December 2023. This letter serves as Chiquita's thirty-fourth monthly update.

On December 2, 2021, the County of Los Angeles Public Works ("PW") requested that these monthly updates include additional details concerning any NOVs issued by regulatory agencies and Chiquita's actions to mitigate those NOVs. This letter provides additional details concerning the NOVs issued since the last monthly update and Chiquita's actions to mitigate those NOVs.

On August 15, 2022, PW requested that these monthly updates clearly indicate whether or not Chiquita received an NOV from any regulatory agencies during the reporting month and, if so, that Chiquita include a copy of the NOV as an attachment to the letter. Since the last monthly update, Chiquita received twelve NOVs from the South Coast Air Quality Management District ("SCAQMD") for alleged violations of SCAQMD Rule 402 and Health & Safety Code section 41700 dated from December 29, 2023 to January 31, 2024. On January 9, 2024, SCAQMD issued Chiquita NOV P79198, dated December 2, 2023, for alleged violations of SCAQMD Rule 3002(c)(1) and Chiquita's Title V permit. On January 12, 2024, SCAQMD revised and reissued NOV P79198, removing the alleged violation related to Chiquita's landfill gas condensate and leachate collection/storage system. Copies of the original and revised NOVs are provided at Attachment B.

On January 10, 2024, Chiquita received an NOV from PW dated January 5, 2024 related to the construction of Flare 3. A copy of this NOV is provided at Attachment C.

On January 8, 2024, Chiquita received a site inspection report from the Local Enforcement Agency ("LEA") related to a November 28, 2023 inspection. The inspection report notes violations for methane gas concentrations above 5% at one monitoring well, observed leachate seeps on top of the scrim, and a failure to keep all aspects of the site in a state of reasonable repair. A copy of this site inspection report is provided at Attachment D.

On January 24, 2024, Chiquita received an NOV from the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board ("Water Board"), alleging a failure to submit an annual report under the State Water Resources Control Board's NPDES General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Construction and Land Disturbance Activities. A copy of this NOV is provided at Attachment E.

On January 25, 2024, Chiquita received a site inspection report from the LEA related to a December 19, 2023 inspection. The inspection report notes violations for methane gas concentrations above 5% at two monitoring wells and requires Chiquita to keep the site in a state of reasonable repair. A copy of this site inspection report is provided at Attachment F.

On October 16, 2023, the Facility and Plan Review Subcommittee requested that these monthly updates include a detailed update on the status of Chiquita's compliance with its Stipulated Order for Abatement with SCAQMD and any other mitigation measures imposed by other regulatory agencies. Detailed information on Chiquita's implementation of the Stipulated Order can be found in the chart enclosed as Attachment G.

On November 21, 2023, Chiquita received a letter from the LEA. The LEA's letter requires Chiquita to implement four CalRecycle-recommended mitigation measures. Chiquita is discussing several of these mitigation measures with the LEA, but has begun implementing the mitigation measures in accordance with the LEA's letter and subsequent correspondence with the LEA. Detailed information on Chiquita's implementation of the CalRecycle-recommended mitigation measures can be found in the chart enclosed as Attachment H.

June 2020 DRP NOV

Chiquita has reached a settlement agreement with the County of Los Angeles (the "County"), which includes terms affecting Conditions 77 and 79. This settlement agreement was approved by the County Board of Supervisors on October 11, 2022. The settlement agreement requires

Chiquita to submit an application to modify its CUP consistent with the terms of the settlement agreement. Those terms include proposed modifications to Conditions 77 and 79. Chiquita submitted the required CUP modification application on November 10, 2022. The hearing on the June 2020 NOV is stayed pending the outcome of this CUP modification process.

Chiquita continues to work on securing the permits and approvals required to begin construction on the new entrance along Wolcott Way under Conditions 77 and 79. Chiquita has provided updates on the June 11, 2020 NOV and Conditions 77 and 79 during previous meetings of the Chiquita Canyon Landfill Community Advisory Committee (the "CAC"). A link to these previous meetings and meeting materials summarizing the status of Chiquita's implementation of activities related to Conditions 77 and 79 can be found on DRP's website, here https://planning.lacounty.gov/public-hearings-and-meetings/chiquita-canyon-landfill/community-advisory-committee/. Chiquita is happy to continue to provide these updates at future CAC meetings if requested.

SCAQMD Rule 402 NOVs

The SCAQMD Rule 402 NOVs were issued due to odors that allegedly emanated from the Chiquita Canyon Landfill (the "Landfill"). The source of any odors coming from the Landfill is a large and unexpected increase in the production of landfill gas and liquids at the Landfill. This increase in landfill gas and liquids production is due to an abnormal biotic or abiotic process (a reaction) taking place within a portion of the Landfill waste mass. More information on the landfill reaction, recent air monitoring data, and analyses from Chiquita's toxicologists can be found on Chiquita's Odor Mitigation website, here: https://chiquitacanyon.com/reports/odormitigation/.

On September 6, 2023, Chiquita entered into a Stipulated Order for Abatement with the SCAQMD to address the SCAQMD Rule 402 NOVs issued by SCAQMD inspectors as a result of the landfill reaction. On January 17, 2024, after two full days of hearings before the SCAQMD Hearing Board, the Hearing Board approved a modified Stipulated Order. The modified Stipulated Order contains over 30 new and modified conditions designed to continue investigating and addressing the landfill reaction and mitigating the impacts felt in the community. A copy of this modified Stipulated Order will be provided once it is available to Chiquita. More information on Chiquita's implementation of the Stipulated Order can be found in Chiquita's monthly reports to the SCAQMD, which are posted on Chiquita's Odor Mitigation website, and in the chart provided in Attachment G.

LEA Site Inspection Reports

On January 8, 2024, Chiquita received a site inspection report from the LEA that notes violations of 27 CCR 20921 (Gas Monitoring and Control) for methane gas concentrations above 5% at monitoring well GP-15, 27 CCR 20790 (Leachate Control) for leachate seeps on top of the scrim between monitoring wells GP-13 and GP-15, and 27 CCR 20750 (Site Maintenance) for an alleged failure to keep all aspects of the site in a state of reasonable repair.

On January 25, 2024, Chiquita received a second site inspection report from the LEA that notes violations of 27 CCR 20921 (Gas Monitoring and Control) for methane concentrations above 5% at monitoring wells GP-13 and GP-15 and 27 CCR 20750 (Site Maintenance), requiring Chiquita to keep the site in a state of reasonable repair.

The methane exceedances are due to the increased production of landfill gas caused by the landfill reaction. When Chiquita is unable to collect all of the gas produced, it either moves up as surface emissions, or it moves laterally as subsurface migration. To address these exceedances, Chiquita has been installing new wells in the area, tuning the new and existing wells, and improving vacuum reliability for the soil vapor extraction wells by installing a new vacuum line connected to one of the portable thermal oxidizers.

With respect to the leachate seeps, Chiquita has protected and continuously maintained its leachate and landfill-gas condensate containment systems. There was no breakdown or failure of the existing leachate containment structures, and the cover and liner were designed in accordance with applicable state and local regulations. The Landfill has been experiencing an unusually large increase in leachate production for its geographical location, which the Landfill was not designed to handle, nor required to be designed to handle. Chiquita continues to implement the leachate-related mitigation measures described in its prior monthly update letters. More information on Chiquita's efforts to address leachate seeps can be found in Chiquita's December 22, 2023 formal written response to the Water Board's November 22 NOV, which is posted on Chiquita's Odor Mitigation website. In addition, to address potential seepage during heavy rainfall, Chiquita placed a berm at the base of the western slope to assist with directing rainwater off the scrim. Chiquita also installed additional scrim on top of the berm. The berm and additional scrim will allow rainwater to shed more efficiently and reduce pooling and weight so that leachate continues to flow towards the sump during heavy rainfall.

Flare 3 NOVs

NOV P79198: On January 9, 2024, Chiquita received NOV P79198 from SCAQMD for alleged violations of SCAQMD Rule 3002(c)(1) and Chiquita's Title V permit for failing to properly maintain and keep Flare 3 in good operating condition at all times; failing to have all connectors, valves, and openings of Chiquita's landfill gas condensate and leachate collection/storage system sealed or closed at all times; and failing to comply with all regulatory requirements and permit terms and conditions. On January 12, 2024, SCAQMD revised and reissued revised NOV P79198, removing the alleged violation related to Chiquita's landfill gas condensate and leachate collection/storage system. The factual bases underlying this NOV are unclear to Chiquita. Chiquita is discussing this NOV with SCAQMD to better understand the alleged violations.

<u>January 5 PW NOV</u>: On January 10, 2024, Chiquita received an NOV from PW dated January 5, 2024 for violations of the Mechanical and Plumbing Codes, a notice to comply, and a NPDES correction notice. This NOV is related to the construction of Flare 3. This NOV was based on a misunderstanding and was resolved. Chiquita has since passed its inspection.

Water Board NOV

On January 24, 2024, Chiquita received an NOV from the Water Board alleging a failure to submit an annual report pursuant to the State Water Resources Control Board's NPDES General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Construction and Land Disturbance Activities by September 1, 2023. Chiquita is discussing this NOV with the Water Board to address the alleged violation.

Chiquita looks forward to continuing to provide the Task Force with updates on the June 11. 2020 NOV and any NOVs issued by regulatory agencies. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

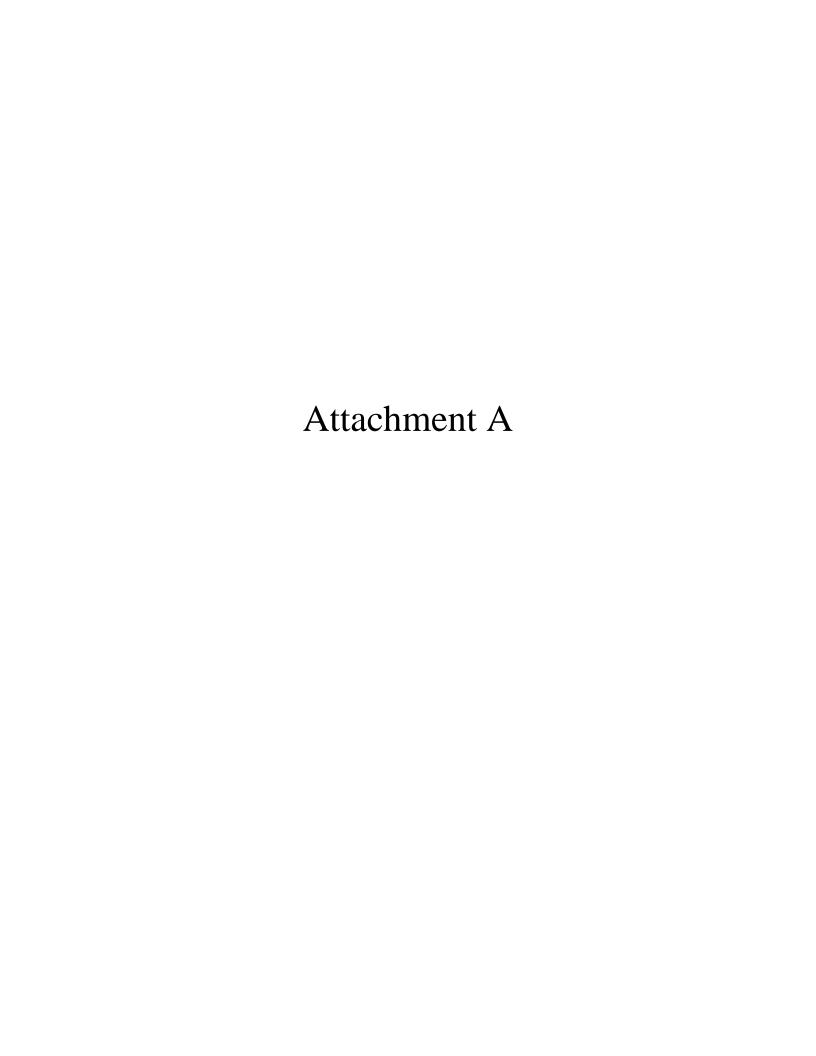



What is a Notice of Violation?

A Notice of Violation is issued by an SCAQMD Air Quality Inspector to inform a business that a failure to comply with one or more applicable federal, state, and/or local (SCAQMD) air pollution rules and regulations or legal requirements is being alleged.

What happens when I receive a Notice of Violation?

If you are operating in violation of one or more applicable federal, state, and/or local (SCAQMD) air pollution rules and regulations or legal requirements, each day or part of a day that you operate in violation is considered a separate violation even if only one Notice of Violation has been issued. Continuing to operate in violation may subject you to substantial civil or criminal penalties. It is in your best interest to resolve any compliance problem immediately before you resume operation.

What if I need to continue to operate the equipment named in the Notice of Violation?

If continued operation of equipment cited in the Notice of Violation is necessary, you may be able to obtain a variance from SCAQMD's Hearing Board. A *variance* is an administrative order that allows a company to continue operating without penalties while it takes appropriate steps to meet air pollution control requirements. Proof of specific legal circumstances must be provided before a variance can be granted. Timeliness in seeking such relief will be considered by the Hearing Board. Additional information concerning variances can be found in California Health & Safety Code §§ 42350-42359.5 and at http://www.aqmd.qov/home/about/hearing-board.

During a hearing for a variance, you may be represented either by yourself or by your attorney or consultant. You will have the opportunity to present evidence and testimony, and to cross-examine any SCAQMD witness.

If you fail to comply with any order of the Hearing Board, you may be subject to additional civil or criminal penalties set forth in California Health & Safety Code §§ 42400 et seq. and 42402 et seq.

How are Notices of Violation resolved?

The SCAQMD General Counsel's office reviews each alleged violation and, based on the facts, determines how best to resolve the allegation. Options available to the General Counsel's office include:

Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program

Certain Notices of Violation may be eligible for resolution through SCAQMD's Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program if they are issued to a minor source or for violations other than emitting air toxics or creating a

public nuisance involving injury or property damage.

If your case is handled by this program, you will receive a letter or phone call from an investigator in the SCAQMD General Counsel's office offering to settle your violation. Settlement terms usually call for a penalty payment and written proof of current compliance. The investigator's name and telephone number are included in the initial settlement letter in the event you would like to discuss the case.

Be prepared to describe any facts about the violation that you believe SCAQMD should know in considering your case. Sharing your knowledge of the facts, possible causes for the violation and plans to avoid future violations will help the investigator arrive at an appropriate disposition.

Be sure to respond by the date indicated in the letter to avoid further legal action.

If the Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program fails to result in a settlement, your Notice of Violation may be referred to an SCAQMD attorney and handled under the procedures for Civil Prosecution or resolved through a Small Claims Court.

Civil Prosecution

If your case is handled as a civil matter, it will be reviewed by an attorney from the SCAQMD General Counsel's office, who will typically make first contact with you through a letter that asks for information about your case. If the allegations in the Notice of Violation cannot be informally resolved, the SCAQMD is authorized to file a civil lawsuit in court to recover civil penalties. In cases involving serious harm or danger, however, SCAQMD may immediately commence a legal action for civil penalties and a court-ordered injunction. A mandatory injunction is a court order compelling a person and/or company to take specific action. A prohibitory injunction is a court order compelling a person and/or company to refrain from taking a specific action. Injunctions, which may even lead to shutting down a business, may be sought by SCAQMD to prevent continuing or serious violations or damages from occurring.

Criminal Prosecution

If SCAQMD determines that criminal prosecution is appropriate, the case will be referred to the appropriate state or federal law enforcement agency. That agency will determine if criminal prosecution is warranted.

Civil and Criminal Penalties

Penalties are determined by California Health & Safety Code §§ 42400 et seq. and 42402 et seq.

What is a Notice of Violation?

A Notice of Violation is issued by an SCAQMD Air Quality Inspector to inform a business that a failure to comply with one or more applicable federal, state, and/or local (SCAQMD) air pollution rules and regulations or legal requirements is being alleged.

What happens when I receive a Notice of Violation?

If you are operating in violation of one or more applicable federal, state, and/or local (SCAQMD) air pollution rules and regulations or legal requirements, each day or part of a day that you operate in violation is considered a separate violation even if only one Notice of Violation has been issued. Continuing to operate in violation may subject you to substantial civil or criminal penalties. It is in your best interest to resolve any compliance problem immediately before you resume operation.

What if I need to continue to operate the equipment named in the Notice of Violation?

If continued operation of equipment cited in the Notice of Violation is necessary, you may be able to obtain a variance from SCAQMD's Hearing Board. A *variance* is an administrative order that allows a company to continue operating without penalties while it takes appropriate steps to meet air pollution control requirements. Proof of specific legal circumstances must be provided before a variance can be granted. Timeliness in seeking such relief will be considered by the Hearing Board. Additional information concerning variances can be found in California Health & Safety Code §§ 42350-42359.5 and at http://www.aqmd.qov/home/about/hearing-board.

During a hearing for a variance, you may be represented either by yourself or by your attorney or consultant. You will have the opportunity to present evidence and testimony, and to cross-examine any SCAQMD witness.

If you fail to comply with any order of the Hearing Board, you may be subject to additional civil or criminal penalties set forth in California Health & Safety Code §§ 42400 et seq. and 42402 et seq.

How are Notices of Violation resolved?

The SCAQMD General Counsel's office reviews each alleged violation and, based on the facts, determines how best to resolve the allegation. Options available to the General Counsel's office include:

Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program

Certain Notices of Violation may be eligible for resolution through SCAQMD's Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program if they are issued to a minor source or for violations other than emitting air toxics or creating a

public nuisance involving injury or property damage.

If your case is handled by this program, you will receive a letter or phone call from an investigator in the SCAQMD General Counsel's office offering to settle your violation. Settlement terms usually call for a penalty payment and written proof of current compliance. The investigator's name and telephone number are included in the initial settlement letter in the event you would like to discuss the case.

Be prepared to describe any facts about the violation that you believe SCAQMD should know in considering your case. Sharing your knowledge of the facts, possible causes for the violation and plans to avoid future violations will help the investigator arrive at an appropriate disposition.

Be sure to respond by the date indicated in the letter to avoid further legal action.

If the Minor Source Penalty Assessment Program fails to result in a settlement, your Notice of Violation may be referred to an SCAQMD attorney and handled under the procedures for Civil Prosecution or resolved through a Small Claims Court.

Civil Prosecution

If your case is handled as a civil matter, it will be reviewed by an attorney from the SCAQMD General Counsel's office, who will typically make first contact with you through a letter that asks for information about your case. If the allegations in the Notice of Violation cannot be informally resolved, the SCAQMD is authorized to file a civil lawsuit in court to recover civil penalties. In cases involving serious harm or danger, however, SCAQMD may immediately commence a legal action for civil penalties and a court-ordered injunction. A mandatory injunction is a court order compelling a person and/or company to take specific action. A prohibitory injunction is a court order compelling a person and/or company to refrain from taking a specific action. Injunctions, which may even lead to shutting down a business, may be sought by SCAQMD to prevent continuing or serious violations or damages from occurring.

Criminal Prosecution

If SCAQMD determines that criminal prosecution is appropriate, the case will be referred to the appropriate state or federal law enforcement agency. That agency will determine if criminal prosecution is warranted.





27 CCR 20790 - Leachate Control

The operator shall ensure that leachate is controlled to prevent contact with the public.

On the west facing reaction area slopes, leachate was observed flowing and pooling on top of the installed Scrim (between monitoring wells GP-13 and GP-15).

27 CCR 20750 - Site Maintenance

The operator shall implement a preventative maintenance program to monitor and promptly repair or correct deteriorated or defective conditions with respect to requirements of the CIWMB standards, and conditions established by the EA. All other aspects of the disposal site shall be kept in a state of reasonable repair.

Due to leachate outbreaks and stability issues with leachate saturated slope and waste, the issues with high temperatures, landfill gas collection, excessive leachate production, and unusual and large-scale settlement, the LEA is requiring CCL to complete the following actions, as recommended by CalRecycle's site inspection on 11/2/2023 and records review:

1. Reaction Break/Barrier

CCL must provide a plan to construct a soil reaction break/barrier at a predesignated area(s) if the reaction reaches the determined action line.

- A. Develop a soil reaction break/barrier plan and propose a set of criteria that would require CCL to install a soil reaction break/barrier between the reaction and operational areas of the landfill.
- B. To obtain necessary data to determine the action line, CCL needs to collect data regarding intensity, depth, speed and direction e of the reaction. It is imperative that CCL installs temperature monitoring devices by January 8, 2024.

2. Cover

Because of the ongoing reaction, the cover that is currently in place is not adequate and not performing to the standards to maintain the site in reasonable repair.

- A. Place and compact a minimum cover of 24 inches of 1 x 10-6 low permeability soil in and around the Reaction Settlement Area and any well showing signs of a reaction.
- B. Develop a written plan that includes documentation and tracking of the fissures, settlement, and tension cracks in the soil cover for LEA review and approval by December 6, 2023. The written plan needs to include a photo log of the fissure location including the length and severity. Upon LEA approval, CCL must submit a weekly report to the LEA by each Tuesday.

3. Slope stability

Given the prior slope instability on the western slope near the leachate outbreak, CCL shall perform a slope stability analysis in this area for LEA review, as saturated waste has very low shear strength. Submit a work plan with a timeline for LEA review and approval by December 14, 2023.

4. Manufacturer Maximum Temperature Design Specifications

CCL needs to collect temperatures in and around the reaction area to meet the manufacturer's temperature design specifications/recommendations to ensure that the

French drain does not fail due to elevated temperature of the leachate soon after installation, leaving leachate seepage without control at the site. This additional step is necessary because of the ongoing reaction and to ensure that the public does not come into contact with leachate.

The following was observed during the periodic inspection:

- Morning weather conditions were sunny and cold (49°F- 60°F).
- No issues were observed with the routine operations of receiving and handling the daily MSW waste stream.
- Cover materials used the previous day were soil and tarps.
- Litter and dust control were satisfactory.
- C. A. Rasmussen operators were observed working on the new entrance road.
- Odor mitigation equipment (misters and orchard fans) were in use throughout the site.
- The operator installed the Scrim over the reaction area's west facing slopes. However, leachate was observed pooling and flowing on top of and within the Scrim.
- No evidence of leachate was observed leaking through slopes or pooling around gas wells on the north side of the landfill above GP-11.
- The operator has eliminated the flow of leachate into the Perimeter Concrete Drainage Channel (PCDC).
- All previously discharged leachate has been removed from the PCDC. Also, the entire length of the PCDC has been pressure washed by landfill staff.
- LEA staff conducted gas monitoring with site staff at perimeter monitoring wells and methane concentrations above 5% by volume were detected at GP-15.

- The report was discussed with site management and a copy will be emailed.





- The new entrance road construction is ongoing. Additional traffic control has been provided at critical crossing areas.
- The majority of the leachate containing baker/frac tanks were collectively relocated just west of the current working face.
- The previous issue noted with above ground leachate discharge on top of the Scrim, has been corrected. An additional layer of Scrim material has been installed over the initial applied layer.
- The November inspection report violation for Leachate Control (20790) has been abated. No evidence of leachate was observed above ground on or adjacent to the reaction area.
- LEA staff conducted gas monitoring with site staff at perimeter monitoring wells and methane concentrations above 5% by volume were detected at GP-13 and GP-15. (see LFG Monitoring log sheet)
- LEA requests that the site continues providing weekly monitoring reports for GP-13 and GP-15.
- As per site management, Ameresco was operating at 50% capacity.
- Reviewed site records were satisfactorily maintained.
- This report was discussed with site management and a copy will be issued via email.




