# Part IV. Zero Waste Baseline Report Recommendations

The July 1, 2024, Baseline Report recommends that the state:

1. Surpass existing waste and emission reduction mandates and goals.
2. Identify and address gaps and overlaps to make current waste management systems more sustainable, effective, and cohesive.
3. Improve understanding of the full lifecycle of materials from beginning to end to reduce loss and discourage disposal within a closed loop economy.
4. Combat environmental health and justice issues associated with the lifecycle of material production, consumption, and waste generation.
5. Maximize environmental, social, and economic benefits of a circular economy.
6. Stimulate growth of our state's circular economy.
