Since 1988, I have worked with the various permitting and enforcement agencies of the City, County, and State that oversee the Sunshine Canyon Landfill and other City and County landfills. I have regularly represented the community as a founding member of the Granada Hills North Neighborhood Council (GHNNC) by responded to Environmental Impact Reports (EIRs) and Mitigated Negative Declarations (MNDs) for most local projects in the northeast end of the San Fernando Valley and Santa Clarita Valley such as: the Sunshine Canyon Landfill – City & County Expansions, LAPD Academy Training Facility, Sunset Farms, MWD Jensen Filtration Plant Expansion, Bradley Landfill Expansion, Cascades, Las Lomas (SFV/Santa Clarita), Holy Cross Hospital Expansion, Henry Mayo Hospital Expansion (Santa Clarita Valley), DWP Terminal Hill Tunnel and Shaft Project, and two different oil pipelines that have entered the San Fernando Valley.

I have been involved in various solid waste disposal and recycling efforts in the greater Los Angeles area. I sit on the County Integrated Waste Management Task Force's Alternative Technology Advisory Subcommittee (ATAS), and contribute to the Facility & Plan Review Subcommittee, and to Task Force meetings as the public for the last 15 years barely missing any meetings. I have in the past participated in and contributed to the City's Zero Waste program, SWIRP, and RENEW LA,. I am currently the President of the North Valley Coalition of Concerned Citizens Incorporated (NVC), and I and the organization, have been committed to protecting the health of families and the environment in the Los Angeles area for over 36 years now. I am a County of Los Angeles Commissioner and have served as the Vice Chair and Chair of the Sunshine Canyon Landfill-Community Advisory Committee (SCL-CAC) for the City & County of Los Angeles (SCL-CAC) for the past 15 years and have served as their representative to the Sunshine Canyon Landfill-Technical Advisory Committee (SCL-TAC) as well.

I have served as the Vice President of the Environmental Affairs Commission for the City of Los Angeles, and environmentally speaking, apart from supporting the Granada Hills community, and the City and County enumerated above, I am the President of the Patriot Oil Community Benefit Trust Fund whose primary purpose is to fund worthy projects that will protect, enhance, beautify, educate, reward or be of general benefit to the residents in the area, and have donated over one million dollars to the community since 2002.
