



Issued on November 16, 2011


Permitted Daily Tonnage: 3,600 tons per day

Permitted Hours: 6:00 am to 8:00 pm (Monday thru Saturday)

Accepted Materials: Mixed Municipal, Inert, Industrial, Green Materials, Contaminated Soil, Construction/Demolition, and Agricultural Waste

Maximum Elevation: 3,200' above MSL

Landfill Expansion Area




Landfill's Expansion Scope and Current FOC

- City of Palmdale Planning Commission approved Modification (PC-2025-009) on November 13, 2025.
- Expansion Scope
 - Acreage Increase:
 - Existing Acreage: 185 Acres
 - Proposed Acreage: 351 Acres
 - Change in Operational Hours
 - Allow Sunday Operations from 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM for only residential hand delivered waste
 - Future Renewable Natural Gas Facility
- Current FOC Approved on 10/18/2018

 2. The Proposal will not be considered to be complete without the following: Certified Final Environmental document, the Land Use/Conditional Use Permit, consistency with the local jurisdiction's General Plan, and all other Requirements listed on Table 10-1 of Chapter 10.
 3. Any Project Proponent that has been granted a FOC and fails to meet the conditions required, the Task Force may revoke the FOC. The reason for the revocation shall be documented in the Notice of Revocation to the local jurisdiction, appropriate local Enforcement Agency, California Department of Resources and Recovery, and the Project Proponent.
