Calvary Cemetery Pedestrian Path

Project Scope: The primary objective of this project is to widen the existing sidewalk along the 2-mile-long perimeter of Calvary Cemetery to accommodate a 5-foot wide rubberized path, pedestrian lights and parkway trees.

- o Installation of recycled tire rubberized walking path.
- Narrowing of pavement and reduction of traffic lanes on Downey Road to accommodate walking path.
- Removal/planting of parkway trees.
- o Relocated and new street lights.
- New pedestrian lights.

The project is being designed by a consultant hired and paid for by Metro. Public Works is coordinating with Metro's consultant to ensure design activities are completed and will administer the construction contract. Construction costs will be financed with Measure R funds.

- **Project Benefits:** This project complements the on-going improvements in East L.A. to improve access to the Metro Gold Line. It promotes active transportation and improves public health by providing a convenient location with a resilient walking surface to encourage residents to exercise.
- Community Outreach: AECom (Metro's consultant) presented the project at 3 community events in 2013/2014. This project was also presented to the Greater East Los Angeles Advisory Group on November 18, 2014. Another community meeting will be held in late of 2017. A project information flyer and a preconstruction brochure will be provided just after the project has been awarded and a week prior to start of construction, respectively.
