ATTACHMENT B

CITY OF BELL GARDENS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

The following is intended as an attachment for building and grading plans and represent the **MINIMUM** standards of "good housekeeping" which must be implemented on **ALL** construction sites regardless of size.

- Eroded sediments and other pollutants must be retained on site and **may not** be transported from the site via swales, area drains or natural drainage courses.
- Stockpiles of earth and other construction related materials must be protected from being transported from the site by the forces of wind or water.
- Fuels, oils, solvents, and other toxic materials must be stored in accordance with their listing and are not to contaminate the soil and surface water. All approved storage containers are to be protected from the weather. Spills **may not** be washed into the drainage system.
- Excess or waste concrete **may not** be washed into the public way or any other drainage system. Provisions shall be made to retain concrete waste on site until it can be disposed of as solid waste.
- Trash and construction related debris must be deposited into a covered receptacle to prevent contamination of rainwater and dispersal by wind.
- Sediments and other materials **may not** be tracked from the site by vehicle traffic. The construction entrance roadways must be stabilized so as to inhibit sediments from being deposited into the public way. Accidental depositions must be swept up immediately and **may not** be washed down by rain or by other means.
- Any slopes with disturbed soils or denuded of vegetation must be stabilized so as to inhibit erosion by wind and water.

The above Best Management Practices are detailed in the "California Storm Water Best Management Practices Handbook, January 2003"

Owner's Certification Statement for Minimum Requirements

National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) is the portion of the Clean Water Act that applies to the protection of receiving waters. Under Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) permits, certain activities are subject to RWQCB enforcement. To meet the requirements of the Los Angeles County Municipal Storm Water Permit (CAS614001) issued to the City of Bell Gardens, the City of Bell Gardens has adopted minimum requirements called Best Management Practices (BMPs) (see Attachment B) for storm water runoff management from development construction activities. These include requirements for sediment control, erosion control and construction activities control to be implemented on each project site.
